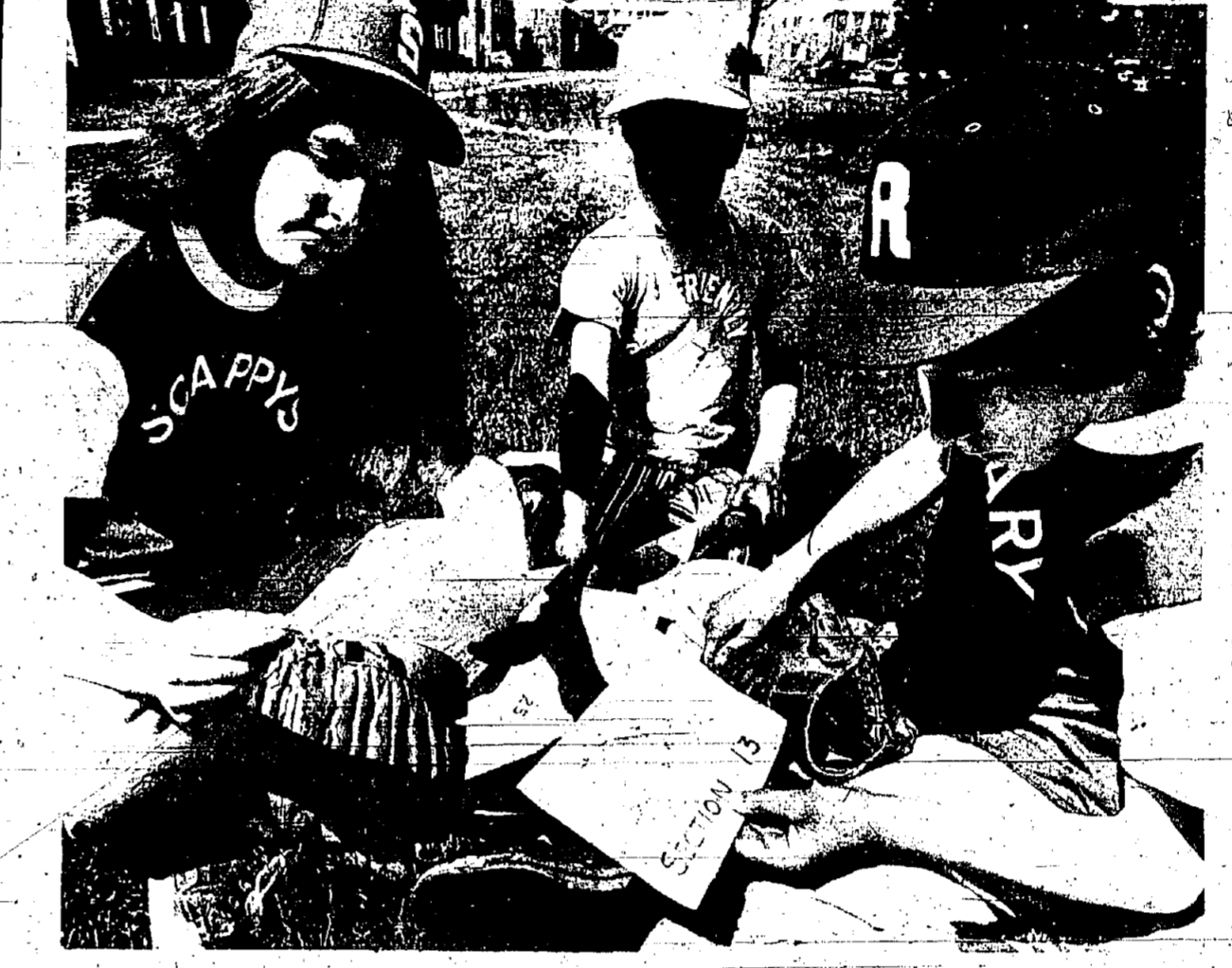

### Martin joins 'family' German students visits here

The Neal Blumenthal family of Springfield currently are playing host to a 49-year-old visitor from Germany and are loving every minute of it, especially since the youth arrived in this country already considered a member of the family.

Blumenthal noted Martin's visiting here while Marc is still in Germany is quite an unusual occurrence among AFS families. "Sometimes the members of a host family will come to the United States a year or two after the AFS student leaves, but it's very rare to find family members visiting concurrently," she said, noting "Martin and Marc figured this visit out on their own."

Blumenthal explained Martin's vacation comes just after he has completed final high school exams, comparable in some ways to the tests given here, but of much more importance in Germany. "If Martin scores well on these exams, the biggest of his life; he will get into a university. If not, he cannot attend college," she said.

All students who have completed high school in Germany must first pass five to six weeks of four, takes the tests, and those who pass may attend any university they choose. That choice is not limited by ability to pay tuition, since all German colleges are free.

Martin and Marc thought it would be a good idea for Martin to visit his host family for several years," she noted. Martin, who speaks fluent English—having studied it since the seventh grade—enjoys his host family, but he is not a native speaker of the language. In Germany, everyone has to go into the military before they can enter college," he said. "This makes for older students at colleges, since most are freshmen at the age of 21, the age most American students are graduating."

When Martin finishes his college education, he would like to become a language teacher. "Learning other languages is much easier for German youth than it is for Americans," he noted, since the former are more easily exposed to other cultures. "In Germany you only have to drive a short distance before you are in another country with another language. In America the borders are very far away," he said.

Martin noted Marc carries the same course load he did at Dayton, but that there is no major difference between American and German secondary schools. "During the last three years there is no mandatory attendance. We may come to class or not. We just have to write an excuse for ourselves," he said. Although that may seem an ultra-liberal attitude to some Americans, the students still realize that they must be prepared for those final exams, which will determine their educational future.

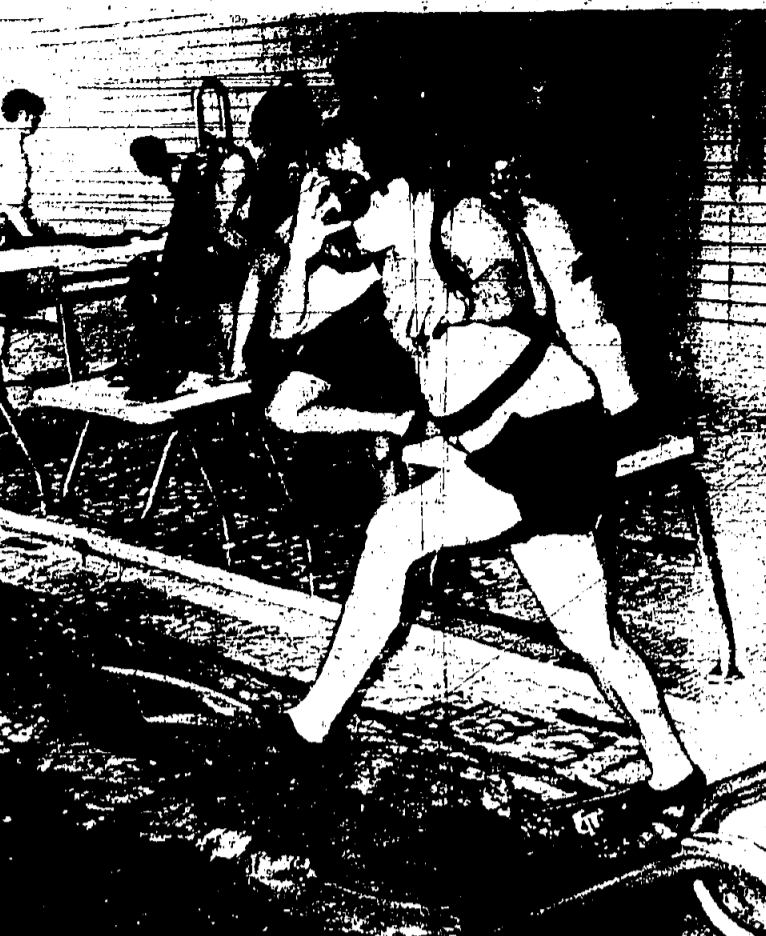

WASHINGTON—The 1974 edition of the Occupational Outlook Handbook says that educational requirements will continue to rise for most jobs...

The 842-page handbook, just issued by the U.S. Department of Labor, emphasizes that post-high school training, such as that obtained through apprenticeship and junior or community colleges, will take on increased importance.

The Occupational Outlook Handbook reports employment prospects through the mid-1980s for more than 850 occupations, and 39 major industries.

Among other things, it is designed to give young people up-to-date, accurate vocational information. In addition to forecasting the need for more education, the new edition reveals that:

Two out of three job openings that will arise through 1985 will stem from the need to replace workers who retire, die or leave a third of openings will result from employment growth.

with agricultural traits, several alternatives are possible, he said. But they all have one feature in common: Large land area.

"Large areas are certainly required, but in terms of the land distribution pattern of the commercial U.S., the possibility of commercializing such technology, definitely exists," he said.

There are several other factors that may come into play here. For one, Dr. Klase noted that little work has been done to increase the carbon content of plants.

Another factor is that the plants need to be confined to land. In fact, he pointed out that the carbon content in many marine plants is greater than in their land-lodged cousins.

"To summarize," said Dr. Klase, "the careful selection of plant species and growth conditions, it appears that sufficient yields of low-cost, high-quality plants can be developed and produced to provide a non-fossil, renewable-carbon feed for conversion to SNG."

Plants represent the most abundant renewable raw material in the world. Dr. Klase said in the article. He has been estimated that the total carbon produced by plants is about 14 billion tons each year.

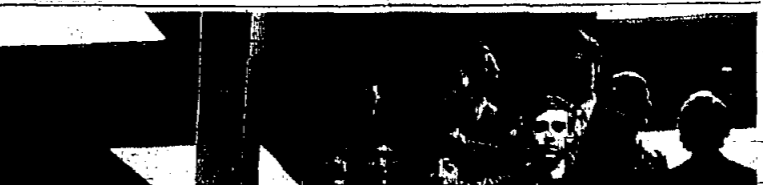
