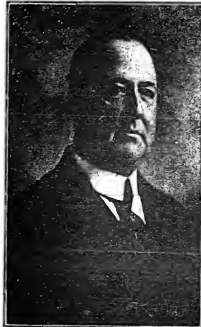

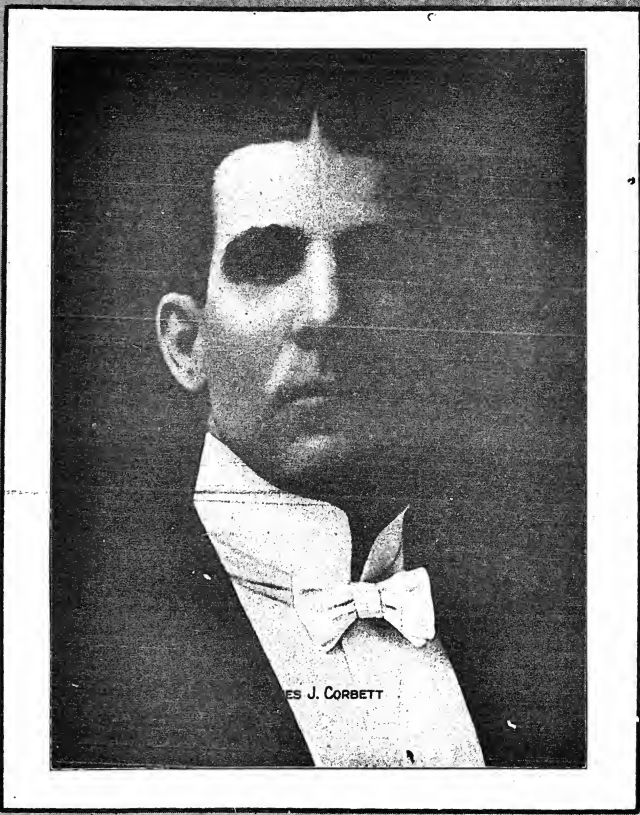

Samuel H. London and Harry C. Bohn found guilty in "INSIDE OF WHITE SLAVE TRAFFIC" case--SENTENCE SUSPENDED.

Samuel H. London, author of the scenario of "The Inside of the White Slave Traffic," and Harry C. Bohn, who was the manager of the theatre in which the film was exhibited and subsequently ordered withdrawn by the New York Police Department, were found guilty of conducting an immoral and indecent establishment.

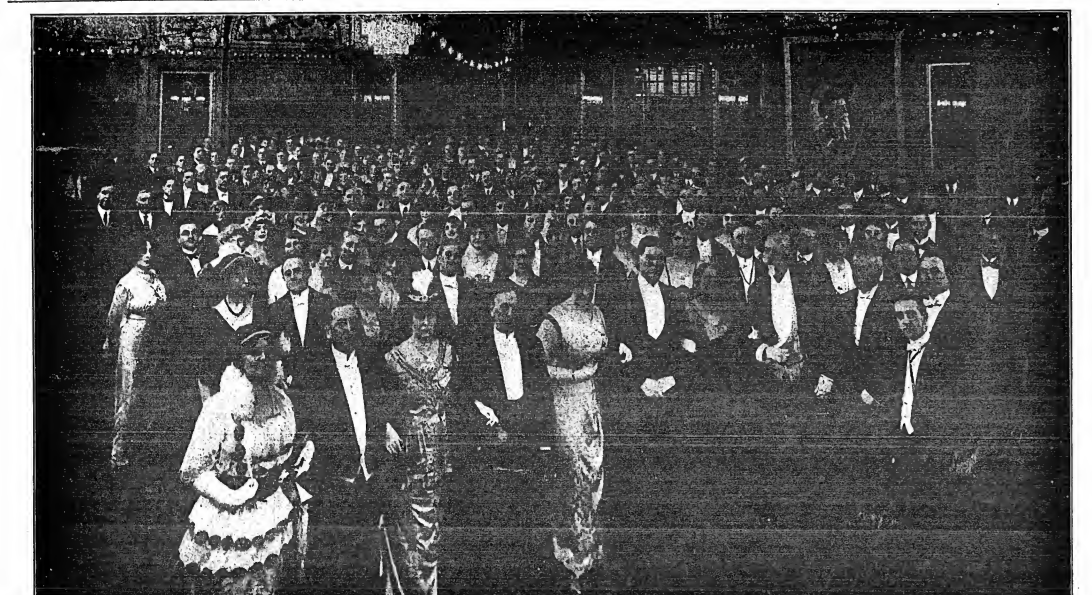
