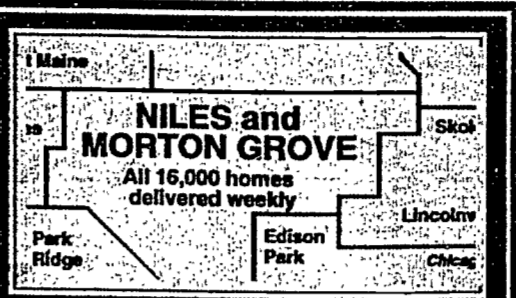

Village of Niles Snow and Ice Control

While most people were wearing shorts and thinking summer vacations, Niles Public Services employees were busy getting ready for another winter season by servicing snow removal equipment and ordering deicing materials, including 4,000 tons of salt. Niles Director of Public Services Jun Noriega stated, "It may seem odd to put so much effort into a program, but the work we do before the snow begins to fall ensures we are ready."

Noriega added, "To help us in our efforts to provide the best snow removal service possible, there are a few things residents can do as well." This includes:

Parking Restrictions

During snowstorms, don't park your car on snow routes, and if possible, side streets. Use a driveway or garage if available. This helps keep a clear path for the plow, allowing drivers to work faster and provide a clear street earlier.

The district has contracted with the security firm to pay them \$238,400 to provide 14 employees to monitor halls and doors at the two schools from 5:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. this school year. The Frain employees will receive \$7 per hour for their services.

Niles sales tax to be increased to 8.5%

Niles Finance Director George R. VanGeem announced Nov. 30 that the total sales tax rate on general merchandise sales will increase to 8.5 percent effective Jan. 1, 2000.

Sales of qualifying food, drugs and medical appliances will not be affected by the increase, VanGeem said, nor does the increase

change the tax rate for items that must be titled or registered by a state agency.

VanGeem advised retailers to adjust cash registers and computer programs by Jan. 1 so that they can start the new year and the new millennium collecting the correct amount of tax.

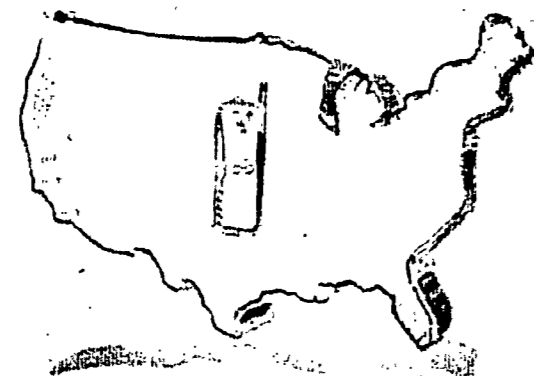

Extreme Mobile Sound goes to extremes for customers

"I specialize in customer service," said Johnny Serbekian, president and owner of Extreme Mobile Sound and Security, Inc., 5838 W. Dempster St. in Morton Grove.

While many mobile sound shops dot the suburban landscape, Extreme provides equipment and service with a big difference.

For one thing, Serbekian is an independent dealer. That means he can offer a variety of brands, mainly AT&T, Sprint PCS and Nextel, and help the customer choose the best equipment for his or her needs. "I want my customers to know what they're buying," Serbekian said.

Another major advantage at Extreme is no contract signing. At most mobile phone places, customers have no choice but to sign up for three years of service from a given provider. At Extreme, you can cancel service with one provider after only one day of service. If a better offer comes along, you won't have to wait six months, a year or even longer to take advantage of it. "Just call and cancel. There's no penalty, no 'buy-out,'" Serbekian said.

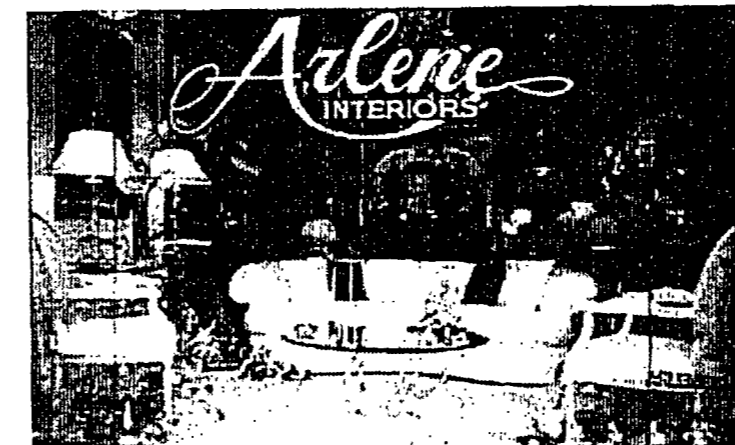

Postman praised for saving baby's life



U.S. Postal carrier Jeff Blalock received an Outstanding Achievement Award from Mayor Nicholas Blase at the Nov. 23 Village Board meeting for his heroic actions in saving the life of a Niles infant who had stopped breathing. Jeffrey Blalock, 37, was at the right place at the right time to save the life of a Niles infant who had stopped breathing.

Blalock was preparing to deliver the mail in the 7400 block of Lawler around 12:15 p.m. Oct. 23 when he noticed Aileen Hodge

run from her home in a panic, her infant son Joseph in her arms.

Blalock, who had four months' emergency medical training in the military, came to the frantic mother's assistance by administering the Heimlich maneuver to the stricken infant.

Apparently dislodging something that had entered the child's windpipe, Blalock said he heard the boy begin to wheeze, indicating that some air was getting through to him.

When Niles police and fire paramedics arrived just moments later, the child was crying and breathing. According to Fire Chief Harry Kinowski, the child had a pulse, was breathing and appeared to be normal when his staff arrived at the scene in response to a 911 call.

The child was rushed to Lutheran General Hospital where medical officials determined that a problem may have caused the cessation of breathing. However, Blalock was still credited with resuscitating the infant.

Blalock's alert and unhesitating assistance was recognized at the Nov. 23 Village Board meeting when both Niles Mayor Nicholas Blase and the Niles Fire Department presented him with certificates of appreciation.

The U.S. Postal Service also recognized Blalock, a Niles postal carrier for two and a half years, with a plaque and a watch.

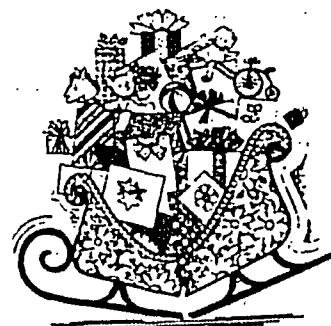

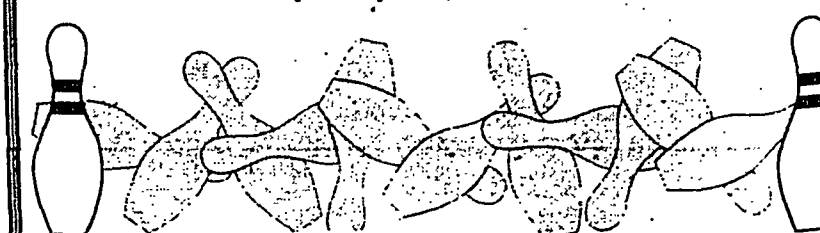

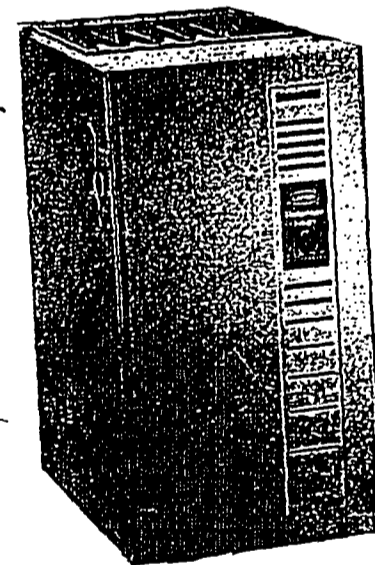

Don't drink and drive

Although drunk driving is a year round problem, it is more common during the holiday season. With the holidays come celebrations where alcohol is served. The belief that coffee, showers or food helps reduce alcohol's effect on the body is false. Only time removes its effects. It takes the body approximately two hours per drink to metabolize alcohol. On average, alcohol is burned up at the rate of about 1/2 ounce per hour - a "typical" drink contains about 1 ounce of alcohol.

Each year, nationally, an average of 20,000 drivers and pedestrians die in alcohol related crashes. If you are the host or hostess, stop serving alcohol a few hours before you expect your party to end. Guests should be offered non-alcoholic beverages. Do not allow a guest who has been drinking heavily to drive home. Take their keys and call a cab or encourage them to stay at your home overnight.

To lessen the amount of alcohol absorbed in the bloodstream: Eat before you begin drinking. A full stomach helps slow the rate of absorption. Drink slowly to give your body time to handle the alcohol. Space your drinks. Know what you are drinking.

Awareness, planning can help make for sober holidays

For people in recovery from alcoholism, holidays can be a threat to sobriety. In fact, the pressures of forced conviviality and family reunions can send any of us into mood swings.

Flip on the television during December and we're likely to find scene after scene of domestic bliss: families gathered around glittering trees, enjoying gentle conversations and a warm fire. Before Bob N., a recovering alcoholic, stopped drinking, he measured his own experiences against that ideal and constantly found them wanting. He remembers feeling a sense of loss around this fact and medicating his grief with alcohol.

Today the holidays have a different flavor for Bob. Though he still experiences tension with his family, he uses the holiday season to renew his Twelve Step program and practice new tools for managing conflict. Two of those tools are awareness and planning -- principles that help let go of unrealistic expectations, acknowledge spiritual traditions, and identify safe holiday customs. The following suggestions underlie those principles:

Seek sober fellowship. If you're in recovery, plan to connect with an AA sponsor or sober friend during the holidays. Also, consider starting a new holiday tradition by throwing an

alcohol-free party for friends, or attend a special AA holiday event. At this time of year, some recovering people find it tempting to let their program slide. It can pay to do just the opposite by giving more attention to the Twelve Steps and attending extra meetings.

Bring your own. You might feel awkward arriving at a party where alcoholic drinks dominate the beverage selection. Prevent this dilemma by bringing your own non-alcoholic drinks. It's not recommended, however, to show up with non-alcoholic beers or wines. The drinking ritual paired with the smell and taste of alcohol can trigger a de-

sire to drink.

Responsible party hosts will recognize that holiday celebrations don't have to center on alcohol drinks and that good cheer can be achieved by offering a range of attractive non-alcoholic beverages.

Take holidays one day at a time. Most holidays officially last only 24 hours. It helps to approach them in exactly that light. If the thought of abstaining from alcohol or other drugs for the whole season seems unbearable, take it one day at a time.

Reconsider family gatherings. People in early recovery might do well to opt out of family gatherings, especially when they center on drinking. Another option is to attend but take periodic breaks to call a sponsor or sober friend. Also, plan to drive your own car so you can leave at any time you choose.

Release resentments. Resentment has been described as allowing a person you dislike to live in your head, rent-free. The

people we resent tend to dominate our thinking and feeling -- a fact that does nothing to resolve our conflict with them.

Resentments that gain steam during the holidays can be disastrous for anyone, especially recovering people. The book "Alcoholics Anonymous" refers to resentment as the No. 1 offender, the most common factor in failed sobriety. When we notice our own resentments, we can remind ourselves of their power and talk to someone in recovery about coping with them.

Return the holidays to a spiritual base. Drinking and drugging derive their own power by delivering a counterfeit spirituality. Using chemicals can create the illusion of self-transcendence and intimacy with others. We can taste the real thing by reminding ourselves of the spiritual basis of the holidays. Most religious traditions stress the power of unselfish giving, and this is a spiritual practice that all of us can cherish during the holidays.

On long-term care insurance...

Long-term care, or nursing home, insurance may not be worth it for you. Your assets and income are most likely to determine your need for it.

- The tax angle**
 - Some long-term care policies' premiums are deductible and some are not. Check with your agent.
 - The costs of long-term care are deductible, though Congress is debating details. Long-term care costs are far greater than a deduction repays, of course.
 - Who needs it?
 - If your income is small (in the \$15,000 per year range) and you have small assets, the answer likely is no. Medicaid will kick in once your finances are exhausted.
 - Middle-income people have a tougher choice deciding between high premiums or retaining their savings.
 - Women are more apt to need long-term care insurance.
 - Individuals (double amounts for couples) with incomes above \$30,000 and large assets (\$75,000 or more not counting the home), probably should take the insurance.
 - If premiums will be less than 10 percent of your income, you probably want the insurance.

Celebrating the holidays when home is a nursing home

'Tis the season to be jolly...and a lot of effort goes into making a long term care facility a special place for the holidays. The experts at The Wealshire, a free standing Alzheimer's care facility in Lincolnshire, have suggestions that can make this holiday season a happy time for everyone.

According to Carly Hellen, The Wealshire's Director of Alzheimer's Education, "often there is an underlying sadness that surrounds holiday visits, with feelings of loss, change and separation, as residents, families and staff try to focus on the season's joys. Families need to be aware of how they can capture the spirit of the season."

Celebrate sensibly

Residents need to be included in holiday festivities, but not overloaded with activities or unreasonably expected to participate. They may have an adverse reaction to the change in every day routine; the increased sensory stimulation from decorations and noise and perhaps visitors. These concerns are especially true for someone with Alzheimer's Disease or other forms of dementia.

The staff members who are caring for a resident all year long appreciate love and support during the holidays because they also become deeply involved with residents and their families.

Where to celebrate

Going home for the holidays, even if just for a few hours, has to be an individual decision, best made by the family with input from the staff. The nursing home usually becomes "home" a place of comfort and routine, and residents generally want to return after being away two to three hours. Going away from their care units can make residents anxious and insecure. It is best to have a trial run the week before, perhaps just going out for a drive or to a restaurant.

"Families need to be especially sensitive to disrupting daily routines," said Hellen, "outing to overcrowded shopping malls and parties are too confusing, but omitting all excursions from holiday activities is also a mistake."

The holidays are all about sharing time and doing things together as a family. Hellen suggests considering the following activities: Drive around and see the lights; visit a church or synagogue; visit a Christmas tree lot; watch children climb up on Santa's knee at the mall; bake cookies, share them with the fire and police departments; take pictures of residents, frame pictures and assist the resident to make cards for their families; celebrate Christmas around the world by watching videotapes, looking at books and preparing special foods; decorate a tree with residents' names and a brief description of a past favorite holiday; gather a strolling group of resident carolers and visit everyone in the facility; make tree decorations using old cards, paper chains, strings of cranberries.

Activities for the season

Generally, residents enjoy simple decorating, singing and subdued parties. Traditional music and worship services give them a sense of grounding and peace. Families can be caught off guard when their loved ones can no longer respond to the beloved rituals of the holidays such as opening gifts or enjoying traditional foods.

Favorite gifts
The best gift for the nursing home resident is a scrapbook

with pictures of family, friends, places visited, favorite foods, poetry, places once lived...the joys of the past, all labeled, perhaps with comments. This gift will be frequently used, especially during future visits. Other gifts that have been very popular and practical include: A bedspread or afghan from home, recut if necessary, to fit the bed; a night light; oversized cotton clothing that is easier to put on; slippers with firm and non-slip

bottoms; washable cardigan jogging suits; a visitor's log, where friends can write personal notes; bulletin board for displaying recent family photos; exercise items: soft sponge ball, colorful scarves, music tapes with a strong beat; at any age, new underwear is always a winner. The safety factors surrounding any gift must be considered. Gifts should contain no small parts, sharp points or toxicity. For example, consider artificial

poinssetia plants rather than real plants, which can cause physical harm if ingested.

Simplify and set limits on celebrations to avoid stress. Take it easy, and the holidays will become a warm memory to cherish and enjoy. Sciatica and Acupuncture

What it does: Acupuncture is a complete medical system that has diagnosed, treated and prevented illness for over 3000 years. While it can remedy ailments and alter states of mind, Acupuncture can also enhance recuperative power, immunity

and the capacity for pleasure, work and creativity.

The cause of sciatica: There are few reasons that one could get sciatica pain. From a biomedical perspective, the cause is generally considered structural in nature, the symptoms having

to do with the sciatic nerve, itself. If the bones of the spine are damaged, or just lined up poorly, they can pinch or irritate the sciatic nerve as it leaves the spine. Often times, the irritation comes about because of a portion of the disc that should remain between the vertebrae, sticks out a little bit from between the vertebrae and pinches the nerve as it exits the area. This creates the pain in the lower back as well as the pain we feel traveling down the back of

the leg and into the foot. Acupuncture can make quick work of the pain, but you may need to see a chiropractor or osteopath if you have serious structural problems in your back that require more mechanical attention. From the perspective of traditional Chinese medicine, we look at the pain as one of a number of problems.

In American culture, we commonly talk about catching a cold. In Chinese medicine, we can catch a cold as well as many

other environmental factors such as catching a damp or wind. Not only that, but these factors can settle into the acupuncture meridians causing pain that may feel hot, or cold, they may move around like wind or become kind of thick and turbid like dampness. In the case of sciatica, we say that one of few different external factors has settled into one of the meridians that traverse the leg. Usually, that is the urinary bladder meridian.

Sciatica . . .

Other factors that can lead to sciatica from the traditional Chinese perspective include a deficiency of Kidney and Liver organs (doesn't mean that there is something wrong with these organs), or the stagnation of the blood circulating through the acupuncture meridians.

The pain associated with sciatica follows almost exactly the path of the urinary bladder meridian in Chinese medicine from the lower back all the way down to the foot. What is causing the stagnation of the Qi energy can be one of many factors such as wind, damp, cold or heat. The fact that it occurs in the urinary bladder's meridian doesn't actually suggest that there is anything wrong with the patient's bladder. It's the same thing as understanding that a pinched nerve doesn't mean that you have a problem with your brain even though the two are connected.

Syndrome Differentiation:
Sciatica due to an invasion of wind, cold or dampness - Pain is aggravated by overcast or rainy weather. The quality of the sciatica pain could include a heaviness, numbness and/or cold sensation along the pain pathway.

Sciatica due to deficiency of the Liver or Kidney (doesn't

mean something is wrong with these two organs) - Sciatica pain along with listlessness and weak knees and lower back. This is usually a long term condition.

Obstruction of the channels by the stagnation of blood due to local trauma - Sciatica pain follows a fall or accident where the leg or lower back has been injured.

Treatments: Fine needles, some so thin as to appear more like wires than needles, would be inserted along the pathway of the pain to move the Qi energy locally and dissipate the external pathogen as well as activate the movement of the Qi energy to remove the pain. Sometimes other points in the body would be used to treat the damp or cold or wind that may have spread out into the rest of the body in addition to the urinary bladder meridian.

Electrical stimulation (electro-stim) can be used on the

des that pass through the leg to provide an even greater amount of stimulation. While the treatment principle is not at all "traditional Chinese medicine", it is a commonly used tool within the acupuncture clinic. The reasoning is that with minute pulses of electricity the local nerves are over stimulated, not with pain, but with a painless electrical shock. This over stimulation makes the nerves turn down their own sensitivity, and hence, all the other pain that travels through those nerves is also diminished.

Wrap-up: It is interesting to me that my first experience with Acupuncture was my own sciatica problem.

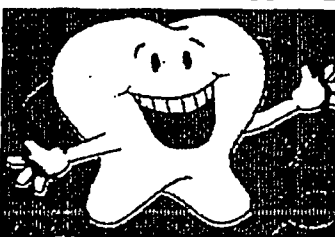

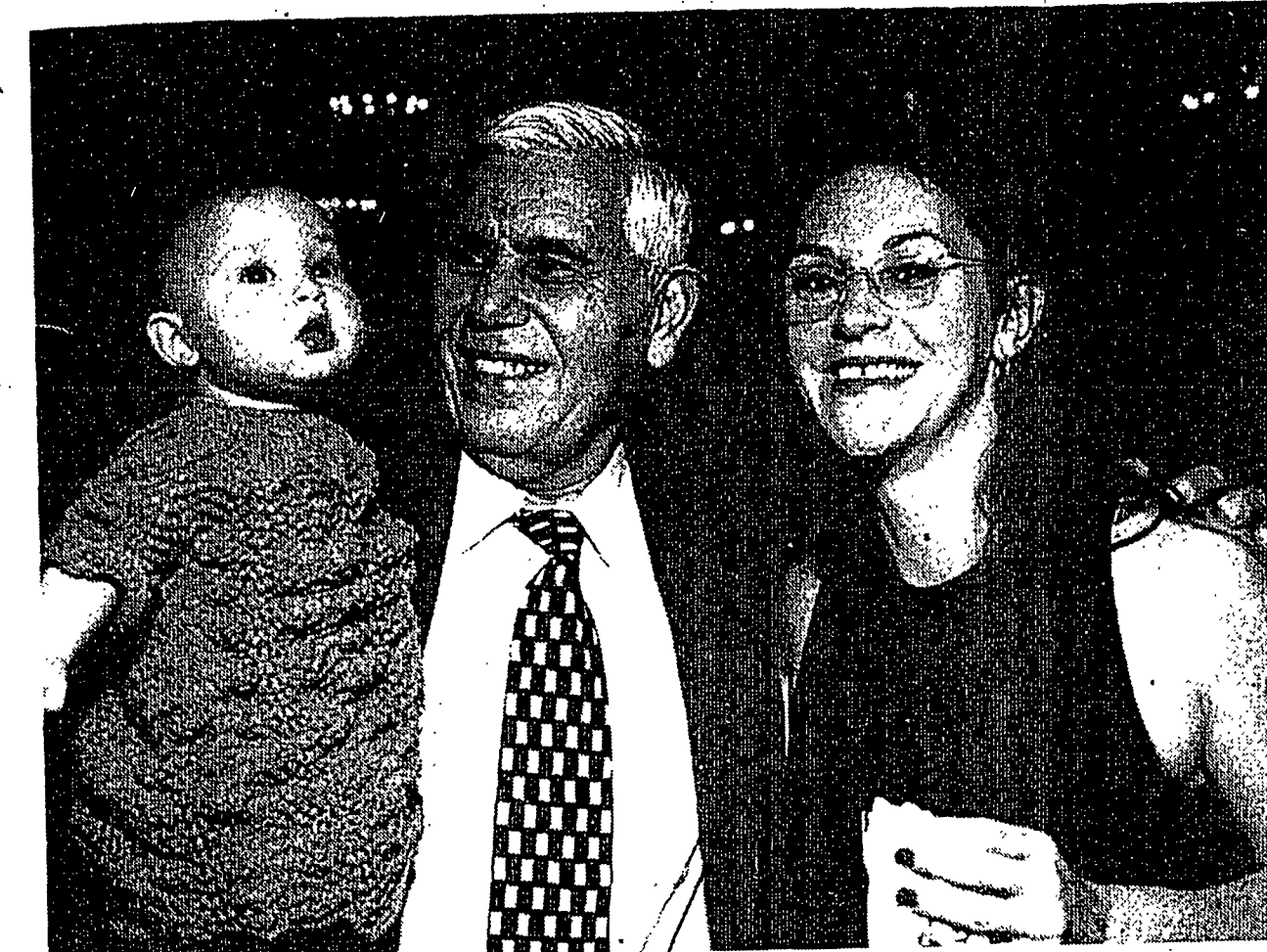

Medications put the brakes on headache pain

For many of us, headaches are an occasional annoyance. But for the 24 million Americans who experience severe, throbbing pain that lasts for hours, or even days, headaches can be cruel and crippling.

"At least twice a month, my headaches were so unbearable that I had to lie in a darkened room for most of the day," said 36-year-old Vanessa Kimmel, a professional in the computer industry who often missed days of work. "It took me years to finally

talk to my doctor. I didn't want to appear weak and I was convinced there was nothing he could do. I was wrong."

What many headache sufferers are learning is that there are many prescription medications that are now available to relieve the pain of most headaches. Being able to describe what kind of headaches you are having is the first step to help your doctor choose the right medication to treat them.

Tension headaches can occur occasionally - or daily. When you

have a tension headache, you may feel a dull, aching, or squeezing pain, usually on both sides of your head that can last for several hours to a full day.

Migraine headaches, which are more common in women, often start in your teen years, and may occur monthly. Most migraine sufferers experience a throbbing or intense pain on one or both sides of their head that can last four to 72 hours. Other migraine symptoms can include nausea, vomiting, and sensitivity

to light and sound.

Cluster headaches are intense 35 to 40-minute attacks that usually occur on one side of your head. You may have several cluster headaches a day for weeks or months - then not again for months or years. Cluster headaches are also more common in men ages 20-45.

While we usually associate headache relief with pain relievers like Excedrin or Advil, another type of headache, **rebound headaches**, are mild to moderate-

ly painful headaches that occur often upon waking when people overuse pain relievers for several days - and stop taking them too abruptly.

While we all react differently, there are some common headache "triggers" that may bring on headaches:

- **Stress** (crisis, death, divorce, job loss or stress, relationship difficulties)

- **Diet** (caffeine, chocolate, nuts, citrus fruits, alcohol, aged cheeses, MSG, processed foods, aspartame)

- **Sensory** (bright or flickering lights, odors)

- **Hormonal changes in women** (menstruation, ovulation, hormone replacement therapy)

If frequent or severe headaches are disrupting your life, talk with your doctor. With so many effective treatments available, there's no reason to let headache pain keep you from enjoying daily activities. For further information about headaches, contact:

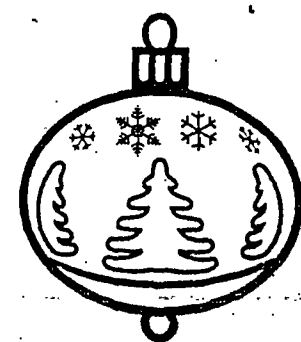

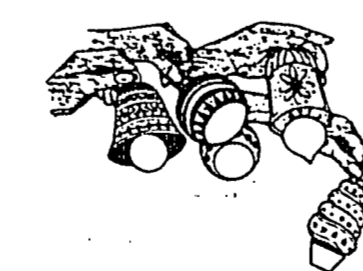

Back at the Town Hall students divided into groups representing some of the many agencies that receive funding through Maine Township and, from the information they were supplied, developed presentations designed to gain more funding or retain existing funding -- in much the same way as actual agencies seek funding each year.

As each group of students made presentations, the "mock funding hearings" were complete with serious questions from the "board" and were met with well documented answers from the "agency representatives."

"Maine Township is mandated to provide certain services to township residents," said Township Supervisor Mark Thompson

concerning the agency request process. "Some services the township provides, yet others are too expensive for the township to provide, considering the full or part time infrastructure and employee costs needed to do so. That's why the township funds many agencies that provide some of those social services to the township, and these students had an in-depth experience on how the process works."

Home Style

Start the millennium off right organize your closet or pantry

An old Shaker saying tells us to "hold no object which you do not believe to be beautiful or know to be useful." With this in mind, you can attack your closet or pantry with confidence.

First things first. Before you invest in shelving supplies, get out some big black garbage bags and give your closets and pantry a good cleaning. Show no mercy. Beautiful and useful stay, everything else goes. Keep an eye out for charitable donations and recyclables.

Now that the space is empty, measure it completely and head to your local home center, where shelving options abound.

If you're looking for sheer utility, ventilated shelving may be your best bet. The epoxy-coated wire is durable, corrosion-resistant and strong. The ventilated nature of the shelves promotes air flow, diminishing the chance of mildew.

"This is one of the most economical options and it's a project that any beginner can accomplish in just a few hours," says Gene Barnes of The Home Depot.

If the shelves will be visible at all times, you may want to consider using wood instead. Seal the wood by painting it to inhibit moisture, which can cause warping and compromise durability. Decorative metal brackets will support your heavier loads, and molding can add to a more elegant look.

For very long wooden shelves that will hold heavy loads, three-quarter to one-inch pine is inexpensive and durable. For the strongest shelves, use a harder wood like oak. Supports should be placed every 4 feet, using L-shaped brackets.

"A high quality bracket made of strong metal is important for sufficient support," Barnes says.

When storing your belongings, be sure to use proper packing materials. Covered plastic bins stack easily and can hold several items. For long-term storage, the plastic bin can prevent rodent or insect infestation. For smaller items, something as simple and inexpensive as a resealable plastic bag or jar can do the trick. Label the contents clearly on the container.

Consider what you'll be using, and how often. Place little-used

As you approach the holidays, remember that grief is both a necessity and a privilege. It comes as a result of giving and receiving love. Be patient with yourself. And allow yourself to be surrounded by loving, caring people.

No simple guidelines exist that will take away the hurt you are feeling. However, the following suggestions will help you cope better with your grief during this joyful, yet painful, time of the year.

1. Accept the likelihood of your pain. Actually, few holidays were ever picture perfect.
2. Feel whatever you are feel-

ing. Express your emotions.

3. Plan ahead. Take charge where you can. Be flexible. Choose or create rituals that bring meaning and acknowledge the person who has died.

Wallpapering around tight spots

Hanging wallpaper around sinks and pipes requires careful cutting into the body of the wallpaper strips. You'll need to hold the strip so the patterns match and

then cut from the edge closest to the fixture.

If possible, cut along a pattern line to hide the slit. At the end of the slit, cut an opening to fit around the fixture, cutting as close as possible to the fixture without damaging it.

On wall-mounted sinks, tuck the small ends of the wallpaper overlaps behind the sink rather than cutting flush with the edge of the sink. This technique will provide a more professional and finished look, according to the experts at The Home Depot.

Be sure to use the type of wallpaper that is best suited for the specific area in which it will be used. Washable wallpaper can be cleaned with mild soap and water and a sponge. Scrubbable wallpaper is durable enough to be scrubbed more frequently with a soft brush.

Brush the wallpaper strip up to the edge of the sink. Cut horizontal slits in the wallpaper, leaving 2-1/4 inches overlap on the top and the bottom of the sink.

Trim the wallpaper around the side of the sink, leaving a slight overlap. Be careful not to scratch the sink fixture.

Smooth the wallpaper with a brush. Tuck the excess into the crack between the sink and the wall, if possible; otherwise, trim the overlap.



Survey explores Web security issues
