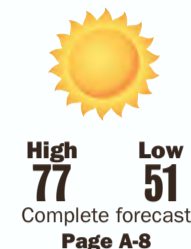

Graduations set for the collective Class of 2023

Weather or not, the Class of 2023 is set to go forth this week and weekend across the region.

It begins with three separate, outdoor ceremonies Wednesday for graduates of the Monongalia County Technical Education Center on Mississippi Street.

Diplomas and certificates of completion will be presented on MTEC's campus at 8:45 a.m., 10:45 a.m. and 1 p.m.

Preston High seniors walk across the stage on the football field 7:30 p.m. Thursday.

University High's Class of 2023, who will gather on the UHS field for their diplomas at 7 p.m. Friday.

Trinity's seniors go forth in ceremonies in the school gym, also on Friday, at 6 p.m.

Pony Lewis Field is the place for Morgantown High's seniors, who will take part in commencement there at 10 a.m. Saturday.

Clay-Battelle's seniors turn their tassels on the school football field in Blacksville at 3 p.m. Sunday.

Rain in recent years has been an uninvited guest at many of the ceremonies.

However — right now, at least — that doesn't appear to be a meteorological concern, AccuWeather said.

Green Bag Road project to help fund community gardening

It looks as if the long-discussed and argued-over Gree Bag Road intersection project may be popping up rutabagas before it's putting down roundabouts.

Morgantown Monongalia Metropolitan Planning Organization Executive Director Bill Austin recently told members of the MPO Policy Board that he's working with the Federal Highways Administration and the West Virginia Division of High-

ways to implement a project in support of community gardens.

Because one of the two roundabouts proposed for the project will take out a community garden at the intersection of Green Bag Road and Kingwood Pike, the NEPA, or National Environmen-

tal Policy Act, study of the project required a community garden component.

"What we proposed with the NEPA process with the city (Morgantown) was to actually have a

An overnight ride-along with Mon EMS

On a rainy Tuesday night in Morgantown, overnight crews at Mon EMS prepared for the unknown. An unnerving thought to some, these professionals thrive on the knowledge that at any moment they could be called to the scene of anything from a shooting to a drug or alcohol overdose. They could even be called to deliver a baby.

A car accident, mental health crisis, stabbing, or heart attack — any could be the next to come over the radio calling one of the six or seven EMS units stationed throughout Mon County to the scene.

Night shift crews typically see more cases involving overdoses and traumas, compared to the health problems like chest pains that are more common during daylight hours — but anything can happen anytime. So whatever that next call might be, they are always ready to do whatever is needed to ensure those on scene received the medical needed.

For paramedic Brandii Linn and EMT Keith Intorre, partners

working from station 60 on J.D. Anderson Drive, this particular evening would begin with what some might say is the unexciting part of the job — a patient transport from Mon General Hospital to a nearby rehabilitation and care facility.

Emergency medical services transporting non-emergency patients might not immediately come to mind when thinking about the day-to-day services they provide, but a patient transport from one of the area hospitals to a longer-term care or rehab facility is one of the more common calls crews receive, the duo explained.

A transport may not be the type of call that gets their adrenaline pumping, but for Linn, a 13-year veteran of Mon EMS, these calls offer much more than a chance to use their medical training and expertise.

"These are my favorite because you get to meet a lot of cool people and hear their stories," Linn said as she and Intorre chatted with their current patient while swiftly but gently navigating the gurney through the hospital halls to

the ambulance.

After seeing him safely to his destination, they make sure all paperwork and communication from the hospital is transferred to ensure the same level of continued care.

A short time later they are off to their second patient, the victim of a possible drug overdose at Sheetz on the Mileground, who had been aroused by Monongalia County deputies.

As Intorre pulled the ambulance into the parking lot, an unexpected scene occurred as one of the deputies was attempting to apprehend a man who was actively resisting.

However, this was not their overdose victim — he was calmly standing off to the side under the watch of a second deputy.

Unfazed by this unexpected twist, Linn and Intorre sprang into action. Linn headed straight for the patient and began speaking with him, allowing the deputy to help his partner detain the surprise suspect. Intorre, a military veteran, checked on the deputies — who were quickly able to detain the second man together after safely bringing him to the ground.

Dunbar Stop Part 6: Some final issues and parting comments

In the final installment of our series on alleged misspending of public funds by the Dunbar School Foundation Stop program — offering COVID vaccine and testing services to the black community in a four-county area — we look at a few last issues raised and provide some final comments from both sides.

As a reminder, the Department of Health and Human Resources told The Dominion Post: "If you are asking whether the DSF administered the grant in accordance with all the terms and conditions of the grant, particularly as related to federal financial management standards, internal controls requirements, procurement standards, and cost principles, DHHR has reason to believe that the DSF did not fully comply due to the DSF's overall lack of understanding with said terms and conditions."

"If you are asking whether the DSF knowingly engaged in acts of fraud or corruption or attempt to defraud the government or corrupt its agents; acts that constitute a cause for debarment or suspension; or acts which violate the False Claims Act or the Anti-kickback Act, DHHR has not yet made a formal declaration or issued a written opinion on the matter."

ATM withdrawals

Stop records show three ATM withdrawals totaling \$4,003. It's not clear what this was spent on. "Once the review is complete, DHHR will have a better understanding of the financial system within the Dunbar School Foundation," DHHR said again.

process where applicants from various neighborhoods can apply for those funds to implement a community garden project," Austin explained, adding "It's actually funding that's available urban-area-wide, so if someone from Star City or Granville or Westover wanted to apply, they could apply for it as well."

But the community garden that's on part of the land the DOH needs is still there.

Asked when or if that land would be obtained by the state, Austin said funds for the project will be obligated in the coming fiscal year, which runs July 1 to June 30, 2024.

"Of course, if it is a contested acquisition, then they have to go through the condemnation process and all of that," he said.

Given the vocal opposition voiced by property owners in the area for years now, that seems all but guaranteed.

Dirar Ahmad, project manager for the DOH, said construction plans are currently in progress and scheduled to be complete by early winter, at the latest. Further, he said, right-of-way plans are currently under review.

All that being said, Policy Board member Ron Justice said maybe everyone should hold off on financing gardens, at least for now.

"If that [Green Bag] project gets canned, if someone uses that money, will they have to give the money back?" he asked. "Because there's certainly two trains of thought in the community right now. One is that project is going to go and the other is that project is not going to go. Personally, at this point, I

don't know ... I know what we've done, but I don't know if it's going or it's not, personally."

Based on the latest available information, the Green Bag Road project will cost \$19 million — including \$3 million in right-of-way improvements in fiscal year 2024 and \$16 million in intersection construction in fiscal year 2025.

It will impact 1.65 miles of Green Bag Road between Napa Auto Parts and Aarons Creek Road and will include a widening of Green Bag Road as well as roundabouts at the intersections of Green Bag Road and Mississippi Street, and Green Bag Road and Kingwood Pike/Dorsey Avenue. It will also add various pedestrian and stormwater upgrades to the area.

Refocused on the reason for their presence, they check their patient's vitals and ask about his history of drug use. Remaining non-judgmental and expressing genuine concern for his well-being, they offered several times to take him to be evaluated at the hospital.

This particular overdose was from fentanyl, which Linn warned him is causing an ever-increasing number of deaths in our area — as she kindly but firmly pleaded with the man to enter a rehab facility.

Before leaving the scene, the pair checked on the deputies and their detainee, who had been reported to police for causing problems in the area earlier in the day and happened to appear while they were waiting for EMS on the overdose call.

Throughout the night, Linn and Intorre respond to a few more calls including a highly intoxicated woman having a mental health crisis and an unknown problem at the Sabraton Sheetz — this call remains unknown as the woman had vanished in the short time it took for arrival.

On at least two occasions during the course of the evening, a patient urinated mid-transport, but that is all in a day's work for EMS personnel.

"You should petition for them to put bathrooms in here for us," Linn joked, trying to reassure one woman who was in tears after she was unable to hold her bladder.

Two of the most commonly used supplies while transporting patients are vomit bags and spit hoods, the pair said.

"We get spit on a lot," Intorre said, explaining that many times their patients do not want to be taken to the hospital and those who may be having a mental health or drug or alcohol issue will sometimes resort to spitting on them in protest.

Another patient encoun-

tered by Linn and Intorre that evening was known to have problems with alcohol and a tendency to be combative with EMS crews. In fact, this would be the third time he was transported to the hospital in the previous four days.

The scene was familiar to Linn and Intorre: The man was unconscious on the floor, a bit of blood coming from his ear and the back of his head. Despite several attempts, they could not rouse him and took him out to the ambulance to begin running vitals and evaluate his condition. While he was indeed intoxicated, his glucose level was dangerously low, a reading not seen before on this patient.

As Intorre carefully navigated the roads to J.W. Ruby Memorial Hospital, Linn got to work in the back of the ambulance, quickly administering I.V. fluids to the man with a steady hand, seemingly completely unaware of the constant sway of the moving vehicle.

Their patient now in the care of emergency room staff, the duo quickly but thoroughly clean and restock the ambulance as they did after each call that evening, ensuring they are once again ready for anything.

En route back to station 60, they encounter several colleagues assisting with an elderly woman who had been spotted by a newspaper carrier wandering near W.Va. 705. After discovering she had wandered away from a nearby nursing

home, it became a team effort to coax the confused woman into returning with them.

However, this type of teamwork is common at Mon EMS — and that becomes apparent almost immediately when observing the station. When units coming off shift pull in, others immediately jump into action helping to wash and restock their vehicle

"We're like a big family," Linn said.

That family feeling can be seen throughout Mon EMS. Linn and Intorre noted the availability of in-house training for required certifications, a variety of continued education classes, and some flexibility with scheduling — something they said is not available at every EMS agency and greatly appreciated. Intorre, who has been with Mon EMS for a year and half, started as an emergency vehicle operator and because of the certification classes they offered, was able to become a certified EMT.

While this rainy Tuesday night may not have been the busiest or most exciting, Linn and Intorre were kind of OK with that, they said.

"Last month, every shift we had someone who was deceased," they said — a chilling reminder that along with "excitement" in the world of emergency medical services often comes trauma and death.

Luckily, there are highly trained emergency medical personnel ready to respond — with nerves of steel and gentle hands — to help in any way they can.

Mother of young girl who died in Border Patrol custody says pleas for hospital care were denied

McALLEN, Texas — The mother of an 8-year-old girl who died in Border Patrol custody said Friday that agents repeatedly ignored pleas to hospitalize her medically fragile daughter as she felt pain in her bones, struggled to breathe and was unable to walk.

Agents said her daughter's diagnosis of influenza did not require hospital care, Mabel Alvarez Benedicks said in an emotional phone interview. They knew the girl had a history of heart problems and sickle cell anemia.

"They killed my daughter, because she was nearly a day and a half without being able to breathe," the mother said. "She cried and begged for her life and they ignored her. They didn't do anything for her."

The girl died Wednesday on what her mother said was the family's ninth day in Border Patrol custody. People are to be held no more than 72 hours under agency policy, a rule that is violated during unusually busy times.

The account is almost certain to raise questions about whether the Border Patrol properly handled

the situation, the second child migrant death in two weeks in U.S. government custody after a rush of illegal border crossing

severely strained holding facilities.

On Sunday, the average time in custody was 77 hours.

Trans girl misses Mississippi graduation after being told to dress like boy

JACKSON, Miss. — A transgender girl in Mississippi is not participating in her high school graduation ceremony because school officials told her to dress like a boy and a federal judge did not block the officials' decision, an attorney for the girl's family said Saturday.

Linda Morris, staff attorney at the American

Civil Liberties Union's Women's Rights Project, said the ruling handed down late Friday by U.S. District Judge Taylor McNeel in Gulfport, Mississippi, "is as disappointing as it is absurd."

"Our client is being shamed and humiliated for explicitly discriminatory reasons, and her family is being denied a once-in-a-lifetime milestone in their daughter's life," Morris

said. "No one should be forced to miss their graduation because of their gender."

The ACLU confirmed that the 17-year-old girl — listed in court papers only by her initials L.B. — would skip the Saturday ceremony for Harrison Central High School in Gulfport, about 160 miles south of Jackson.

The student "has met the qualifications to

receive a diploma," according to Wynn Clark, attorney for the Harrison County School District.

The ACLU sued the district Thursday on behalf of the student and her parents after Harrison Central principal Kelly Fuller and school district superintendent Mitchell King told L.B. that she must follow the boys' clothing rules.

Marion County Health Department

A \$25,000 contract with Marion County Health Department for storage, personnel and compliance was listed on the initial grant date in April 2021. But MCHD was never paid anything and was written out of the grant in the September 2021 change order.

DSF President and some others The Dominion Post spoke to on background questioned why this occurred.

Hodges said she learned from MCHD that all entities dispensing vaccine had to be independent, and DHHR was requiring that money allocated for MCHD services had to go instead to refrigerators and storage for vaccines at Stop's downtown Fairmont headquarters. So Stop had to reallocate the funds in order to be compliant.

That led to Stop halting its program for two months because they could not handle vaccines until they became compliant, she said.

Final comments

Although Stop is now in the final month of its second grant and looking to the next fiscal year, Richardson still maintains that all the grant funds should have been channeled through DSF and not gone directly to Stop, and that an oversight committee should have been put in place.

Richardson also recently noted that Stop is several months delinquent

on its rent payments for occupying the former Dunbar School cafeteria.

Hodges acknowledged the delinquency and said that as part of the DHHR review, the state said DSF and Stop did not have an arm's length lease agreement; the state views them as one organization and doesn't allow it to pay itself rent. So they have had to modify that line item in their budget and are waiting to hear back from the state.

Hodges asked us to talk to Pastor Wesley Dobbs of Morningstar Baptist Church for some supporting comments, and we called him.

Dobbs said, "I think that what they've done as far as the community is outstanding." Stop visited his church twice offering vaccine shots and information. His church suffered an outbreak early on that sickened eight people, but after Stop got rolling there were no further outbreaks.

"They wanted to activate the community, they wanted to let them know the danger of COVID. ... They really woke this community up."

Stop also provided jobs for some people, he said. Rather than Stop's spending, he said, the focus should be on the help it has given and the lives that were saved.

The Dominion Post has submitted some additional questions to DHHR about Stop records for Fiscal Year 2024, and is awaiting the completion of the review for a later story.

Biden aims to reassure world on U.S. debt as he consults with Indo-Pacific leaders

HIROSHIMA, Japan — President Joe Biden tried to reassure world leaders on Saturday that the United States would not default as he consulted with the heads of Australia, Japan and India in a meeting of the so-called Quad partnership that had been hastily rescheduled because of the debt limit standoff back in Washington.

Hoping to avert an outcome that would rattle the global economy and prove to be a boon to Beijing, Biden opened his third day in Japan at the annual Group of Seven meeting of the world's most powerful democracies with a briefing from his staff on the latest fits and starts in talks over how to raise the federal

debt limit.

The president also squeezed in meetings aimed at challenging China's buildout across the Indo-Pacific. The Quad members originally had planned to meet in Sydney next week, but got together instead on the sidelines of the G7 so Biden could return to Washington earlier on Sunday in hopes of finalizing a deal to increase the U.S. borrowing limit before the government runs out of cash to pay its bills.

Biden said he felt there was headway in the talks with GOP lawmakers.

"The first meetings weren't all that progressive, the second ones were, the third one was," he said before a meeting with Australian Prime

Minister Anthony Albanese. "And then, what happens is the carriers go back to the principals and say, 'This is what we're thinking about.' And then people put down new claims. I still believe we'll be able to avoid a default and we'll get something decent done."

In a sign of a renewed bargaining session in Washington, food was brought to the negotiating room at the U.S. Capitol on Saturday morning, only to be carted away hours later. No meeting was likely Saturday, according to a person familiar with the state of the talks who was not authorized to publicly discuss the situation and spoke on condition of anonymity.

The shortened trip has reinforced a fundamental tension shaping Biden's presidency: As he has worked to signal to the world that the U.S. is reclaiming the mantle of global leadership, at key moments, domestic dramas keep getting in the way.

Until Saturday, Biden had largely stayed out of the public eye at the summit, forgoing big public statements and leaving Friday's leader dinner early. He has been spending time instead by a video monitor in a room next to his hotel suite, where aides in Washington have been keeping him apprised of the back-and-forth of debt limit talks.

Minn. bill legalizing recreational pot passes

MINNEAPOLIS — The Minnesota Senate has passed a bill that would legalize recreational marijuana for people over the age of 21, making it the 23rd state to do so. The measure has already passed the House. It now goes to Democratic Gov. Tim Walz, who has promised to sign it. Supporters say it would improve public health and safety and further social

justice. Opponents counter that public health and safety would in fact worsen. The bill would allow marijuana use at home and establish a 10% tax on cannabis products. Minnesotans who have been convicted of misdemeanor or petty misdemeanor possession would also get their records automatically expunged.

F-18 fighter jet accident at Zaragoza airbase

BARCELONA, Spain — The Spanish defense ministry says an F-18 fighter jet

has crashed at an airbase in the Spanish city of Zaragoza but the pilot ejected successfully. The aircraft landed within the perimeter of the base, the defense ministry said on Twitter. The air force said several hours after the crash that the pilot was "recovering favorably" but would remain in the hospital under observation for "a few days." The Guardia Civil says that its officers rescued the pilot after he parachuted down outside the base. The Guardia Civil says that the pilot suffered injuries to his legs.

Victims of Ore. highway crash were farmworkers

ALBANY, Ore. — An Oregon union says the victims of one of the state's deadliest highway crashes were farmworkers traveling in a van at an hour when agricultural laborers typically commute home after toiling in the harvest. Authorities have not yet released the names of the seven who died or the four who were injured in Thursday's crash on I-5 near Albany. But the PCUN union says all 11 were farmworkers. The Mexican Consulate in Portland also said that the victims were farmworkers. In a statement posted on social media, the consulate said the seven dead and four injured were of Mexican nationality. The driver of the semitruck that struck the van was arrested Friday on suspicion of manslaughter, DUI and other charges.

Pierce Brosnan unveils personal paintings

LOS ANGELES — Actor Pierce Brosnan is publicly unveiling his most vulnerable role yet, hosting his first solo art exhibition. The James Bond actor has been painting since he was a young teen, but picked up the hobby again in the 1980s. It's been intensely personal. One of Brosnan's first paintings as an adult, "One Dark Night," was created while his wife Cassandra Harris was being treated for cancer. Harris died in 1991, and Brosnan's current wife, Keely Shaye

Many looked for his gold-and-blue striped sweater at the Mountaineer games, particularly behind the home team's basket in the Coliseum. Singing Take Me

Home, Country Roads after his alma mater's victories was special to Ade and his family over his fifty years of attending events. A shared love of sport and travel guided many of his recreational pursuits with Ellen and his family, including a special trip to the Cancun Challenge in 2019 to support the WVU men's and women's basketball teams. Ade was devoted to his wife and their daughters and sons-in-law; Presha and Davide, and Mandy and Jay; and to his grandchildren, Eliza Grace and Jack August. He shared many adventures with his family, from car trips spent listening to John Denver on an 8-track tape, to visiting various places in the world. A special trip was one to the castles of Ireland. Never, though, did he venture willingly for long from his home among the hills. He and Ellen were engaged in providing care to their aging parents until their ultimate passing.

John A. Brumbaugh went to be with the Lord on May 18, 2023, due to complications of Alzheimer's. He was born on May 3, 1935, in Buffalo, New York to Claude and Elsie Brumbaugh. John graduated from Hamburg High School in 1953. He graduated from Cedarville College in 1958. On May 31 of that same year, he married his high school sweetheart, Mary Gail Knisely. This year they would have celebrated their 65th anniversary. John attended seminary for one year in Grand Rapids, Michigan, where their first child, Nancy, was born in 1959. This was revolutionary at the time and later patented. Soon after, the DNA sequencer was manufactured and sold by Li-Cor. His love for college students gave him the desire and opportunity to minister to students in Japan with Campus Crusade for Christ several times. He also traveled with his son-in-law to Ukraine in 2000 to

minister to public school teachers with a program called International School Project. Over the years, John and Mary Gail grew to love Colorado. John was especially drawn to the cool mountain air and the many days of sunshine. In 1995, they retired to Estes Park. There they enjoyed cross country skiing, snow shoeing, and hiking. 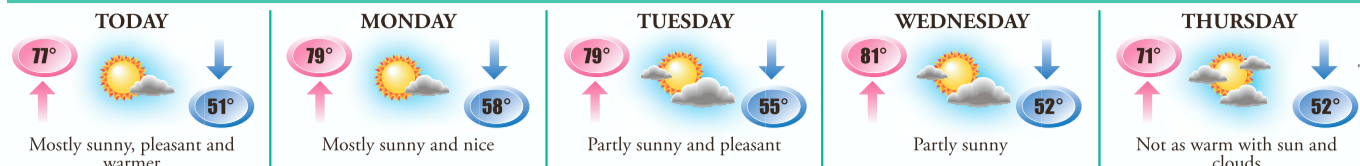

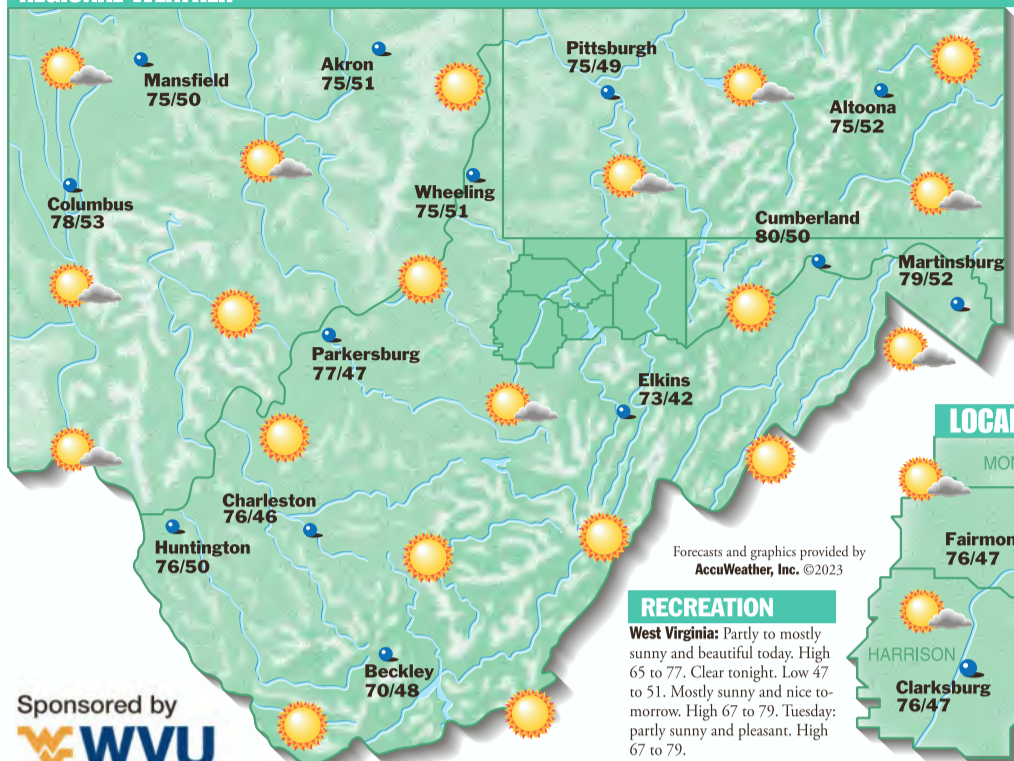

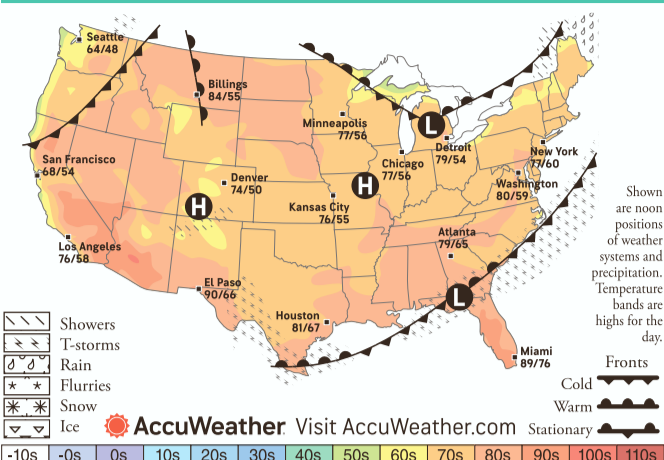

WVU Extension summer camps welcome all W.Va. youth

WVU Today

Youths from across West Virginia head to West Virginia University Jackson's Mill each summer to participate in camps. This year is no different, as WVU Extension offers five statewide camps, including a new addition this summer.

There are countless opportunities for youths throughout the state to attend summer camp, from statewide to specialty county camps, everyone is

welcome. 4-H membership is not required to attend camp.

"West Virginia state 4-H camps provide access to incredible camp experiences and quality summer learning for all West Virginia youth," Jason Burnside, WVU Extension 4-H camping specialist, said. "You don't have to be in 4-H to participate, but it's a great way to learn more about our youth programs, in addition to learning new skills and making lifelong friendships."

The five statewide camps

offered this summer include Older Members Conference (OMC), Junior Firefighter Camp, Camp Jump Start, Alpha I and Alpha II.

Older Members Conference is an annual weeklong camp where attendees learn leadership and civic engagement skills by leading camp activities and discussing current issues. Youths participate in workshops to master new skills that will help them in their futures. This camp will be held June 18-23 and is open to

anyone ages 14-21.

Junior Firefighter Camp provides classroom education and practical training to further students' knowledge and skill in firefighting and emergency operations. Campers will learn CPR, conduct live fire training, learn about aircraft and vehicle firefighting, as well as participating in team building and leadership exercises. This camp will be held June 17-22 and is open to youths ages 14-17.

Got diarrhea? Don't swim!

"LET'S GRILL OUT." "Surf's up!" "Where are you going on vacation?"

Memorial Day weekend is the unofficial start of summer. And while messages such as the ones above may be ringing in many people's conversations, Monongalia County Health Department and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have an important one to add:

"Got diarrhea? Don't swim!"

It might seem obvious, but as Healthy and Safe Swimming Week starts Monday, it's time to review its central message: Pools and poop don't mix.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) (and feel free to finish breakfast before continuing), "One person with diarrhea can contaminate the entire pool." These rules also apply to splash pads.

"Swallowing even a small amount of water contaminated with diarrhea

germs can make you sick for up to three weeks."

So in addition to not taking a dip into a pool if you have diarrhea, it's also incumbent on swimmers who are free of illness to avoid swallowing water at a pool or a splash pad.

Recreational water illnesses (RWIs) are caused by germs spread by swallowing, breathing in mists or having contact with contaminated water. Diarrhea is the most common RWI, but others include skin, ear, respiratory, eye and neurologic infections. Children are more likely to get these illnesses than adults.

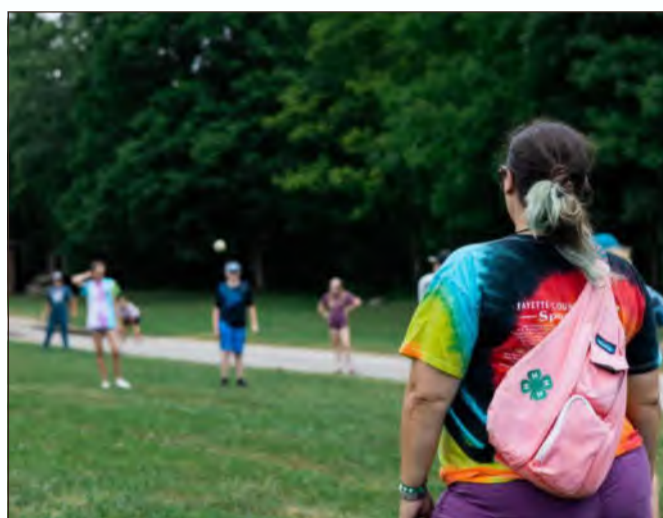

movie is incredibly cliché. Every moment that tries to have any kind of emotional weight is undercut by some platitude you could see embroidered on a pillow. Roman's one-liner begets Tej's one-liner. It is all filler and no substance. They bring Helen Mirren on with an Audrey Hepburn updo to make one "Roman Holiday" joke, and then whisk her away. Additionally, because this movie ends on a significant cliffhanger, it feels even emptier than your average brainless action film.

Because I have seen almost none of the previous movies, I don't have much to compare it to, but the CGI in this one felt overused and almost intrusive at times. I love the big action set pieces, and the pacing is really solid, but there were more than a few times I wish it had been a little smaller to allow

the stunts to shine.

The performances are pretty standard action fare. The return of John Cena was great, and his scenes with Perry are a lot of fun, but the stand-out for me was definitely Momoa. He seemed to know exactly what kind of movie he was in and he embraced it fully. His villainous plans verge on the farcical, his wardrobe is over the top, and his mannerisms are utterly inane. I enjoyed every single second he was on screen.

This movie is absolutely absurd. But the cars are hot, the Coronas are cold, the explosions are loud, and Jason Momoa's nails are on point. For the kick-off to the summer blockbuster season, that's probably enough.

the pool, and to ensure yours and your children's safety when they swim, here are guidelines recommended by CDC:

- Don't swim or let your kids swim when sick with diarrhea.
- Don't swallow the water.
- Check out the pool's latest inspection report. You can do that by going to this website: monchd.org/departments-programs/environmental-health, and then click on Online Inspection Reports.

- Take kids on bathroom breaks every 60 minutes or more if needed.
- Check diapers every 30-60 minutes and change them in a bathroom or diaper-changing area, not waterside.
- Shower before you get in the water.
- Do a mini-inspection of the pool. Here's how:

- Buy strips to test pH and free chlorine or bromine in the pool. These can be purchased at most superstores, hardware stores and pool supply stores.
- CDC recommends pH 7.2-7.8. The free chlorine concentration should be at least 1 ppm in pools and at least 3 ppm in hot tubs/spas. The free bromine concentration should be at least 3 ppm

in pools and at least 4 ppm in hot tubs/spas.

Other segments of the mini-inspection, including making sure the drain at the bottom of the deep end of the pool is visible; the drain covers at the bottom appear to be secured and in good repair; and that a life-guard is on duty at the pool, or that it at least has safety equipment such as a rescue ring or pole.

If a pool does not pass, the CDC recommends. Complaints can be made through Environmental Health at 304-598-5131 or online at monchd.org.

And rest assured that MCHD Environmental Health's registered sanitarians also inspect pools. Each pool undergoes a full inspection twice a year. Sanitarians also stop by each pool bi-weekly to check pH and chlorine. If they receive a complaint, sanitarians respond within 10 days.

Other swimming safety tips, in addition to taking lessons, include using sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 or more, re-applying often. Remember that the sun is harshest from late morning to mid-afternoon. Also, drink plenty of fresh water ... even if it means having to get out of the pool to take another bathroom break.

Treatment options will include aquatic therapy, manual and exercise-based therapies, soft tissue and joint mobilization, post-surgical care, stroke care, functional capacity evaluations, lymphedema care and more.

Jordan Feathers has been named the director of the new center. He comes to WVU Medicine with more than 20 years of outpatient physical therapy experience and deep roots in the Morgantown community.

"We're excited to be

able to offer comprehensive rehabilitation consisting of three disciplines that all work together for the betterment of our clients," Feathers said. our community." Plans for the Outpatient Rehabilitation Center were announced last August, when the West Virginia University Health System Board of Directors approved \$177.4 million in capital projects.

"We are always adding new providers and services to our outpatient clinics throughout the state and region based on the needs of our patients

Flag raised to honor 1st American casualty in Afghanistan

People gathered on the Monongalia County courthouse square on Saturday in remembrance of WVU student, avid bicyclist, surf guitar enthusiast and soldier Gene Vance Jr. — the first American casualty in Afghanistan during the early days of the war of terror 21 years ago.

The annual observance coincided with the 2023 edition of U.S. Armed Forces Day.

Proclamations were read, wreaths were placed and the last American flag to fly over Camp Vance, a military encampment in Afghanistan named in honor of the fallen soldier, was raised in his adopted hometown of Morgantown.

Vance, a military veteran and newlywed who had put off his honeymoon

to rejoin the service after Sept. 11, was critically wounded in a fierce fire fight in Afghanistan.

He managed to rescue several of his fellow soldiers — even as he was bleeding to death.

Many of his acquaintances in University City, where he lived and worked when he wasn't going off to war zones, only learned of his military exploits after his death.

He was a Special Forces operative fluent in Farsi. He had previously fought in the Gulf War and was recognized with a Bronze Star for battlefield bravery.

"For the longest time, I just knew him as 'Gene,'" one of his cycling buddies said, after the news broke.

"Nothing else."

Mountaineers fall to Texas in final game of regular season

Having already clinched at least a share of its first Big 12 title, the No. 6 West Virginia baseball team looked for the outright title on Saturday, but ultimately came up short against Texas, 7-3. The Mountaineers share the title with the Longhorns as well as Oklahoma State as all teams finished 15-9 in conference play, the first

time in Big 12 history with three co-champions.

"It's the first time in the history of the program that we've ever done won the Big 12," said head coach Randy Mazey. "We try every year to accomplish things that have never been done here before and we did that. We have a lot of baseball still left to play, but we can't let one weekend change

how we feel about the season we had."

For the third straight game, the Mountaineers fell behind early as Texas scored four runs in the first before adding runs in the second and third to take a 6-0 lead.

Junior Braden Barry got WVU on the board with a solo home run in the fourth, his eighth of the

season.

Redshirt-freshman David Hagaman kept WVU within striking distance as he threw 3.0 scoreless innings in middle relief.

In the seventh, freshman Sam White hit a two-run home run deep to right field to cut into the Longhorn lead a little bit more.

Texas tacked on an insurance run in the eighth to push its lead

back to four. In the ninth, the Mountaineers put a couple runners on before a double play ended the game.

The Mountaineers will begin the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship on Wednesday. They will be the No. 3 seed and will take on Texas Tech in the opening round at 8:30 p.m. from Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas.

2023 WVSSAC STATE TRACK DAY 2

Morgantown girls co-champions with Jefferson, Trinity strong on day 2 of state track meet

CHARLESTON — The 2023 WVSSAC state track and field meet concluded with day two on a cool, rainy Saturday at Laidley Field in Charleston.

After a strong showing on day one, the Morgantown girls team continued their momentum into day two, highlighted by senior Irene Riggs capturing two more state titles and senior Morgan Ryan earning the top spot in the pole vault.

Trinity Christian captured state championships for both the boys and girls on day two. Sophomore Chase Livengood set the tone early in the long jump just as the track events had gotten started. He jumped a personal best and new TCS school record length of 21 feet 1/4 inch to capture the state title in long jump for Class A.

"As a freshman, I jumped 19'7", and I knew I could improve on that this year," Livengood said after his victory. "Like I said early in the year with the high jump, I wanted more consistency so I really worked hard on that."

TCS coach Jason White says it was easy to tell how much potential Livengood showed coming in last year as a freshman, and that his hard work has led him to this success early on in his high school career.

"Chase is just a raw athlete, he came out last year and had some good jumps," White said. "This year we got more technical with it and he has worked so hard and deserves every bit of this."

The Warriors' girls team captured the state championship in the 4x400 meter relay. The team

of sophomore Cora Friend, senior Sofia Pancoast, junior Jenna Barnett, and sophomore Rylan Sharp posted a time of 4:19.53 for the top spot. Pancoast claimed third in the individual 400-meter dash earlier in the day.

The TCS boys finished in 7th overall with 28 points and the girls 6th with 29.

The University boys placed fourth overall after a strong showing in the 1600-meter run. The Hawks claimed the first, third, and sixth place spots in the race,

with junior Drew Zundell posting an impressive time of 4:08.44 to claim the state championship.

For the Morgantown boys' team, eighth place was earned with 29 points overall in the meet. Highlighting the boys' success was senior Alex Tadros who captured the state title in the 300M hurdles on Saturday with a time of 40.32.

The MHS girls took home five state titles on the weekend in the 4x800, 800, 1600, 3200, and the pole vault. Riggs was responsible for three of those five titles in the

individual races.

Ryan, a senior, entered the pole vault with the top regional height of 11 feet. It only took a height of 10 feet 6 inches on Saturday for Ryan to capture the elusive state championship she has eyed for three years.

"It's amazing," Ryan said through happy tears. "I've wanted this so bad and I couldn't have done this without everyone helping me along the way. I'm honored to be a part of this class at MHS and to be able to be a state champion."

MHS head coach Steve Blinco says this was one of the more-

competitive state meets he can remember, and he praised the efforts of his athletes.

"Saturday's competition definitely lived up to the billing," he said. "We knew Jefferson would be the team to beat on the girls' side and we set our sights high on taking them down. But for all the distance talk with us, the sprints and relays were ready and able to provide the necessary reinforcements."

MHS and Jefferson tied for first place with 111 points each.

ELKINS — Beating the Fairmont Senior girls' lacrosse team is a tough task for an opponent, doing so without your best player is even tougher.

Birds hitting planes becoming more common occurrence

We've always known that birds that hit airplanes cause crashes. One such incident in 2009 brought this problem to everyone's attention.

A US Airways jet taking off in New York struck a flock of Canada Geese, causing both engines to lose power. The pilot successfully guided this jet into the river and all 155 on board went onto the wings of the floating plane and were rescued.

This potential tragedy became known as the "Miracle on the Hudson" and a movie followed. This event not only made the news for days, it also stimulated pilots to start reporting all plane/bird strikes.

If you look at the data of all bird/plane incidents starting in 1990, it gets a bit scary. In 1990 there were less than 2,000 such incidents. In 2000 the number was just over 4,000. In 2010 there were 8,000 reported bird/plane strikes.

In 2019 this number jumped to 13,042 then it dropped slightly and last year there were 12,996 such strikes. These are the numbers where there was no plane damage or just

slight damage.

If we look at the data for planes that either crashed or sustained major damage from bird strikes, the numbers are obviously much lower. In 1990 there were 68 such incidents. In 2000, that jumped to 108. In 2010 there were 83 incidents but that dropped to 9 in 2020 and last year there were only 12. Even so birds hitting planes can be a disaster.

There has been only one incident in recent years (2014) where birds caused a plane to crash, but since the year 2000, 166 planes have had to divert and land because of a bird strike.

Obviously when a bird gets sucked into an engine it may cause that engine to lose power. Usually the second engine can get the plane back to a safe landing. However, in the case on the Hudson River mentioned above, both engines struck birds and the plane lost all power. It was a miracle and a great pilot that allowed that plane to find a safe place to land in the Hudson River.

Why have we seen such a major drop in such incidents since 2015? The airline industry has spent huge money to make things safer. Since 90-95% of all bird strikes occur near the airports, making airports less bird friendly was one way to do that.

Removing ponds and just having low cut grass along the runways helped. Also at major airports peo-

ple have been hired, and different strategies used, to harass and keep birds away.

I might add that there have been some bird strikes at 24,000 feet, but these are not common.

Bird species most often reported in these situations are waterfowl (31%), gulls (26%) and raptors (18%).

A Cornell University study looked at bird strikes at Kennedy, Newark, and LaGuardia Airports. They found that fall migration was the time when the highest number of strikes occurred and suggested that this migration time had more juvenile birds migrating compared to the spring and inexperienced younger birds are more likely to hit planes than older birds.

The species that caused the most damage was the Canada goose, while robins had the highest number of strikes.

For a while bird strikes were getting more common, but that seems to have changed because of the industry spending lots of money to lower the risk from birds hitting planes. Obviously that is a good thing and hopefully that trend will continue.

Koepka a tough customer on a tough day to lead PGA Championship

PITTSFORD, N.Y. — Brooks Koepka has his health back, along with his swagger. Now he gets another chance to restore his reputation as golf's toughest customer in the toughest championships.

Oak Hill was every bit of that on a rainy Saturday in the PGA Championship, and Koepka was up to the task. With three big birdies over the last seven holes, Koepka had a 4-under 66 — the low round at Oak Hill for the second straight day — to build a one-shot lead over Viktor Hovland and Corey Connors.

"I like it when it's difficult. Today was super difficult," Koepka said. And then with the slightest grin he added, "I'll take 4 under."

Now he has to finish it off, just like he did with such great poise when he won back-to-back in the U.S. Open (2017-18) and then back-to-back in the PGA Championship (2018-19), earning the rank of "Major Brooks."

This is his second straight 54-hole lead in a major. He was two ahead at the Masters until playing it safe in the final round and closing with a 75 as Jon Rahm tracked him down and beat him by four shots.

"I know what I did," Koepka said. "I promise I won't show up like that tomorrow."

It wasn't just the Masters.

Koepka was two behind Dustin Johnson going into the final round of the 2020 PGA Championship at Harding Park when he boldly said, "When I've been in this position before, I've capitalized. He's only won one. I'm playing good. I don't know, we'll see." And then he shot 74 and tied for 29th.

A year later, he played in the final group with Phil Mickelson at Kiawah Island in the PGA Championship, played the par 5s in 4 over and shot 74 to finish second.

Koepka has looked so strong that he has made only two bogeys the last two rounds, as pivotal as his 10 birdies on an Oak Hill course that's a brute even in pleasant weather. Only nine players broke par on Saturday. He was more than 6 1/2 strokes better than the average score.

The last player to have the low score in the second and third rounds of a major championship was Tiger Woods in the 1997 Masters, which he won by a record 12 shots.

Koepka, who was at 6-under 204, won't have it that easy.

Connors played Oak Hill like a U.S. Open — that's what this PGA Championship feels like — by opening with two birdies and 13 pars that kept him in front for so much of the wet, grueling day. And then one swing

changed everything.

He was in a bunker right of the 16th fairway when he hit the ball so thin that it disappeared into the lip of the soggy turf. Connors wasn't sure where it went, looking up as if it had bounced out toward the fairway.

It was plugged deep in the sod, and Connors had to drop it in gnarly rough on top of a mound framing the bunker. He did well to advance that toward the green into more thick grass and took double bogey.

"Wish I could have that one back," he said.

Connors, in control for so long, settled himself for two tough pars for a 70.

Hovland overcame mistakes early with three birdies in a five-hole stretch around the turn. But then the Norwegian failed to take advantage of the scoring stretch — Nos. 13, 14 and 15 — and took bogey from the bunker on the 18th hole for a 70.

He will be in the final group of a major for the second time. Hovland was tied with Rory McIlroy in the British Open at St. Andrews last summer and closed with a 74.

Missing from all this activity was Scottie Scheffler, the No. 2 player in the world, who started with two straight bogeys and didn't make a birdie — his only one of the round — until the 14th hole. He shot a 73, but is still very much in the mix.

NASCAR drivers facing unfamiliar venue with All-Star race at North Wilkesboro Speedway

NORTH WILKESBORO, N.C. — William Byron has driven past North Wilkesboro Speedway on his way to the Blue Ridge Mountains. So has Brad Keselowski and many other North Carolina-based NASCAR drivers.

Like most, they'd never been inside the track before this week. And none of the drivers on the NASCAR circuit have raced a Cup

Series car here.

That should make the All-Star race tonight at the restored .625-mile track all the more interesting — and unpredictable — when 24 drivers vie for a \$1 million first-place prize at the refurbished track.

The last time the track hosted a Cup Series race was in 1996 when Jeff Gordon won.

It has sat mostly dormant and unused for the

better part of 27 years until Dale Earnhardt Jr. and Speedway Motorsports CEO Marcus Smith spearheaded an effort to bring it back to life for NASCAR's 75th anniversary celebration.

Some drivers have tried to get a feel for the track using a simulator leading up to this weekend, and others came earlier in the week to race late-model cars just to get in a few laps.

Smith's 2-run homer in seventh inning lifts Diamondbacks over Pirates 4-3

PITTSBURGH — Pavin Smith hit a go-ahead, two-run homer in the seventh inning to lift the Arizona Diamondbacks to a 4-3 victory over the Pittsburgh Pirates on Saturday.

Smith's third homer of the season came off Robert Stephenson and helped the Diamondbacks overcome a 3-2 deficit after Pirates ace Mitch Keller was pulled following six strong innings.

Ketel Marte also homered for Arizona, which won for the sixth time in its last eight games.

"We compete no matter what the circumstances are," Diamondbacks manager Torey Lovullo said. "We don't shut down. That's one of the great characteristics of this team. There's always max effort, max engagement. Their starting pitcher is very good, but we kept it within striking distance and got some clutch hitting."

Ke'Bryan Hayes accounted for all the Pirates' scoring with a bases-loaded triple. He has back-to-back games with at least three RBIs for the first time in his career.

Keller allowed two runs and three hits while retiring 16 batters in a row between the first and sixth innings. He struck out eight and walked none, but Pirates manager Derek Shelton removed him after 84 pitches with a 3-2 lead. Keller had pitched 16 scoreless innings while winning his previous two starts.

Keller is the first Pirates pitcher since at least 1901 to have five straight starts with at least eight strike-

outs and one walk or less.

"The fact that in the sixth inning there he kind of lost his delivery a little bit," Shelton said of his decision to lift Keller. "We saw the pitches started to not have the same action. One of the things that, as well as he's pitched over the last two starts and even today, he hadn't been in the stretch."

"Once he got to the stretch, he kind of lost where his arm slot was."

Lourdes Gurriel Jr. greeted Stephenson (0-2) with a single to lead off the seventh and extend his hitting streak to 13 games. Smith followed by driving a 3-1 fastball over the right-center field fence.

"We did a good job getting Keller out after six by grinding a couple of runs against him," Smith said. "Lourdes gets a leadoff single and then I just tried to keep things simple. (Stephenson) threw me a lot of sliders but I felt he was going to have to come

into the zone with a fastball and I was able to put a good swing on it."

The home run made a winner of Kyle Nelson (4-1), who retired three batters after relieving rookie starter Brandon Pfaadt. Miguel Castro worked around a leadoff walk to Rodolfo Castro in the ninth by striking out the next three batters for his fourth save.

Pfaadt pitched 5 1/3 innings and gave up three runs and six hits while striking out three and walking two. He is winless in four career starts.

There are definitely some things we can take away from this start and keep building on," Pfaadt said. "It was a good day out there."

Marte opened the scoring with a solo homer with one out in the first.

The Diamondbacks didn't get another runner on base until Josh Rojas was hit by a pitch with two outs in the sixth. Rojas

eventually scored on Carroll's single off diving shortstop Tucupita Marcano to draw the Diamondbacks within 3-2.

Hayes' triple put the Pirates in front 3-1 in the third inning. The ball carried over the outstretched glove of Smith in right field and off the out-of-town scoreboard.

The Pirates had won three of four after losing 11 of 12.

Baffert back from ban, wins Preakness with National Treasure after another horse euthanized

BALTIMORE — Bob Baffert choked back tears and his voice cracked while he tried to juggle the conflicting feelings of seeing one of his horses win the Preakness Stakes hours after another was euthanized on the same track.

"This business is twists and turns, ups and downs," the Hall of Fame trainer said. "To win this — losing that horse today really hurt. ... It's been a very emotional day."

National Treasure won the Preakness on Saturday in Baffert's return to the Triple Crown trail following a suspension, ending Kentucky Derby champion Mage's Triple Crown bid in the race Baffert has now captured more than any other trainer. But the joy was tempered by the agony of another 3-year-old colt, Havnameltdown, injuring his left front leg in an undercard race and being put down.

"When he got hurt, it's just the most sickening feeling a trainer can have," Baffert said. "It put a damper on the afternoon."

It also put the sport squarely back in a familiar spot, two weeks after seven horses died in a 10-day span at Churchill Downs leading

up to the Derby.

National Treasure did not run in the Derby at Churchill Downs, where Baffert has been barred the past two years because of a suspension stemming from 2021 Kentucky Derby winner Medina Spirit's failed drug test that led to a disqualification in that race. Medina Spirit was Baffert's most recent Preakness horse, finishing third.

The 5-2 second choice Saturday, National Treasure came through, delivering Baffert a record-breaking eighth victory in the Preakness and his 17th in a Triple Crown race, also the most among trainers.

National Treasure held off hard-charging Blazing Sevens down the stretch to win the 1 3/16-mile, \$1.65 million race by a head in 1:55.12.

"He fought the whole way," said jockey John Velazquez, who won the Preakness for the first time in his 13th try. "He put up a really good fight. ... That's what champions do."

National Treasure paid \$7.80 to win, \$4 to place and \$2.60 to show. Blazing Sevens paid \$5 to place and \$2.80 to show.

Mage finished third after going off as the 7-5 favorite, paying \$2.40 to show. Despite the smallest Preakness field since 1986,

horses at the lead went much slower than in the Derby, which did not benefit Mage's running style of closing late and passing tired rivals down the stretch.

"Slow, very slow," Mage's trainer, Gustavo Delgado Sr., said.

Mage's defeat means there will not be a Triple Crown winner for a fifth consecutive year since Baffert's Justify in 2018.

Baffert became the face of the sport after his American Pharoah ended a 37-year Triple Crown drought in 2015. Since Medina Spirit was DQed from the Derby, though, Baffert has turned into a polarizing figure. In addition to his Churchill Downs punishment, he was forced to miss the Preakness and Belmont last year because of a related suspension in Kentucky that Maryland and New York honored.

On Saturday, he was back at a major race — and, thanks to National Treasure, back in the winner's circle.

"You can't do it without the group of owners I have that have stuck by me through all of this negative, all this bad stuff that's happened to me in the last few years," Baffert said.

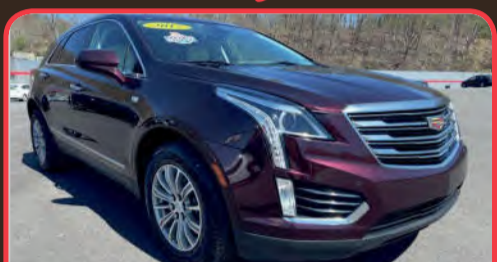

ELECTION REFORM

We need poll workers. And they need protection

ELECTION OFFICIALS USED TO TOIL IN RELATIVE OBSCURITY. Poll workers put in long, intense hours around voting time, filling low-paid bureaucratic roles that were poorly understood by the public they served.

But since 2020, that world has turned upside down. Today, many election workers are the subject of harassment, threats and even acts of violence. Some have had to flee their homes or have been assaulted. One said it's “like nothing I've ever seen.”

The sudden vitriol stems from the Big Lie that the 2020 presidential election was stolen, which has metastasized in voting precincts nationwide. The result is as predictable as it is disturbing: all across the country, election workers are quitting in record numbers. In my own home state of Kentucky — hardly a battleground — about 20% of all county clerks opted to retire rather than run for reelection last year.

Which raises an urgent question for 2024: Who is going to be left to work the elections?

A Boston Globe review of six states — Arizona, Georgia, Massachusetts, Michigan, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin — found a roughly 30% increase in turnover among election officials since 2020. This will only exacerbate an already critical manpower shortage at a time when trust in elections is historically low and declining.

Now think about the following hypothetical: It's November of next year and voting is underway. Throughout the country, polling places are drastically understaffed due to waves of resignations. Many of those who are working are inexperienced. This leads to long lines at the polls and even longer waits for results as

vote counting is conducted by skeleton crews working around the clock.

Last time — in an election widely considered to be the most secure in history — we saw rampant conspiracy theories and simmering violence that culminated in the Jan. 6 attack on the U.S. Capitol. What might we expect in this even graver, more combustible scenario?

And the problem isn't confined to just one side. Over the years, those on the left have registered their share of doubts about free and fair elections. After the 2000 vote-counting debacle in Florida, more than a third of Democrats said they thought the election had been stolen. After Donald Trump's election in 2016, Nancy Pelosi said, “Our election was hijacked. There is no question.” Hillary Clinton called Trump an “illegitimate president.” After losing the Georgia governor's race in 2018, Stacey Abrams refused to concede, saying the election was “rigged” and “stolen.” In the lead-up to 2020, Democrats charged that Trump's postmaster general was trying to “sabotage” the election.

None of which is to draw a false equivalence between the two sides after the 2020 election. The violence of Jan. 6 was appalling. But we see from both Democrats and Republicans a growing tendency to cast doubt on the legitimacy of

elections that their side loses. This spells trouble in 2024.

That's why we must fix the problem, and do it now. The task of restoring Americans' confidence in elections is too great for any single election administrator, agency or legislature to handle alone. It requires cooperation within and between governments at every level. The best way to safeguard against future crises is by building a broad-based, cross-partisan coalition of election defenders who are willing to stand up for the integrity of the vote.

A reform agenda should have two priorities: ensuring no votes are tampered with or cast fraudulently; and preserving access to the ballot for everyone who's eligible. We should provide more funding at the state level to improve voting technology, much of which is hopelessly antiquated. And we should hire more election administration personnel across the board to enable more timely reporting of results.

Common-sense solutions like automated voter registration have proven effective at cutting costs and making voting systems more efficient in red and blue states alike. And doing so improves the accuracy of these states' registration lists without purging voters — something that the “election integrity” crowd and the “voting rights” crowd can both celebrate.

At the same time, we should also work to expose fake or fraudulent security ideas being passed off by politicians who are trying to manipulate our elections. Governors should veto bills that would have the effect of undermining election integrity, as Pennsylvania Gov. Tom Wolf did last year in the



Fridge filled with 'expired' food?

Here's why you shouldn't throw it away yet

IF ON DIGGING THROUGH YOUR FRIDGE YOU FIND FOOD STAMPED WITH A PHRASE SUCH AS “ENJOY BY,” “BEST BEFORE,” “EXPIRES ON” OR “SELL BY,” followed by a date that has passed, you might think it's time to throw it away.

In reality, those dates are mostly arbitrary, largely unregulated and often unrelated to food safety. They're also responsible for a huge share of the food waste that Californians and other Americans generate every year. That could change under legislation being considered in Sacramento.

It's not surprising that consumers are confused by the current state of affairs. More than 50 phrases suggesting expiration have been documented on food labels in the United States. Only a few of these printed dates actually mean the food is no longer safe to eat. Others, such as “Sell by” dates, are meant only to help stores decide when to rotate their stock. The U.S. Department of Agriculture notes that most food is safe even after such dates unless “spoilage is evident.”

Given the lack of clarity about what these dates mean, many consumers employ a “when in doubt, throw it out” strategy. An estimated 20% of household food waste can be attributed to food tossed out because it “expired.” The USDA estimates that more than a third of the American food supply is wasted — more than enough to feed all the country's hungry and food-insecure — and 43% of this garbage is generated at the household level. This suggests that the average American consumer spends around \$1,300 a year on food that is ultimately thrown away.

All of this waste costs us in other ways as well. Food disposed in landfills emits methane as it decomposes. As a greenhouse gas that promotes global warming, methane is 86 times more powerful than carbon dioxide in the short term. Reducing food waste and the resulting methane emissions is therefore most individuals' single most effective means of fighting climate change.

When we waste food, moreover, we have to buy more. Meeting the consequent demand also generates greenhouse emissions, further exacerbating our climate problems.

Legislation by state Assembly member Jacqui Irwin (D-Thousand Oaks) would address this by mandating clearer food date labeling. Assembly Bill 660 would require food sold in California to use one of only two types of standardized labels: “BEST if Used by” or “BEST if Used or Frozen by” would indicate that products will decline in quality or freshness past the date on the label; “USE by” or “USE by or Freeze by” would indicate that a product's safety risks can increase after that date.

These terms already have support from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, the USDA, the California Department of Food and Agriculture and the food industry. They also match the terms used in bipartisan federal legislation on the subject that has been repeatedly introduced in Congress and was recently reintroduced.

'Low' utility rate does not mean affordable

On Sunday, May 15, The Dominion Post published a letter to the editor that suggested rising West Virginia electric power rates are more affordable than several other neighboring and so-called "green" states because they are "low": "The U.S. Energy Information Agency Electric Power Monthly site states, from February 2022 to February 2023, the cost per kilowatt hour in West Virginia went up 1.65 cents to 13.57 cents. Our neighboring states' rates: Ohio 14.60, up 1.94 cents; Pennsylvania 18.29, up 3.81 cents; and Maryland 16.12 cents, up 2.04 cents. The deep "green" state of Connecticut was 34.32 cents, up 7.81 cents. California was 27.07 cents — more than double the West Virginia rate."

The letter concluded: "West Virginia should do its best to hold onto its coal-fired power plants. Our utility rates are low compared to 'green' states."

This is another example of cherry-picking the data to mislead. What does "low" mean in this context? Other data (not referenced in the letter) suggest that "low" does not mean "affordable." Each of the states used as illustrations has a median income that far exceeds ours (source: wisevoter.com):

- Ohio — \$62.7K
- Pennsylvania — \$72.6K
- Maryland — \$97.3K
- Connecticut — \$81K
- California — \$81.6K
- West Virginia — \$46.8K

As West Virginians, the question we should be asking is not whether our electric rates are nominally "low." Instead, let's ask, are they affordable?

We are a relatively poor state. Therefore, affordable energy includes the costs in dollars but also costs in associated health and environmental impacts of coal. We cannot afford to continue clinging to the past.

Don't save Pleasants at Fort Martin's expense

Mon Power recently announced that if it buys the Pleasants Power Station, as requested by the West Virginia Legislature, it will likely close the Fort Martin plant, thus putting 180 people in Monongalia County out of work and causing a \$3.4 million drop in local property taxes. The current owners of Pleasants want to demolish the power station because it is not profitable, despite an annual subsidy of \$12.5 million from West Virginia

taxpayers since 2019.

Mon Power's plan for potentially saving Pleasants requires an additional \$36 million per year surcharge on West Virginia electric rates, to be paid by you and me, simply to give Mon Power time to decide whether to buy Pleasants. Note that this \$36 million payment does not require any coal to be burnt or electricity produced at Pleasants; apparently that would cost even more, because operating Pleasants is so uneconomic.

A recent letter to The Dominion Post declares disappointment that Delegate Evan Hansen doesn't support this plan (DP-5-14-23, "Utility rates bad reason to not buy Pleasants"). In contrast to the author of that letter, I definitely don't feel my electricity bill is "low" and that raising my rates yet again is a good way of propping up an uneconomic power station.

Supporting Pleasants at the expense of Fort Martin is unfair to West Virginia ratepayers and even more so to Mon County. It doesn't even make sense as a pro-coal policy, as either Pleasants or Fort Martin will close, whether the plan is followed or not. The only surprising thing is that, with the exception of Delegate Hansen, most of our politicians don't seem to be concerned about the lack of economic sense in this plan, the higher electric rates it entails or the resulting loss in employment in our area.

THERE IS NERVOUSNESS IN THE HOMES OF AMBITIOUS AMERICAN HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AWAITING THE U.S. SUPREME COURT'S DECISION ON AFFIRMATIVE ACTION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA AND HARVARD UNIVERSITY. Will the justices upend preferences for certain racial and ethnic groups? Will they ruin the chances of many teenagers getting into a top school, which would bring them lifelong success?

The answer to the second question is no, regardless of how the court rules.

Affirmative action admission policies can help colleges achieve greater diversity on their campuses. But in the course of that public debate, we do college applicants great harm if we give them the false impression they will do better in life if they attend highly selective schools.

Long-standing research shows that except for some low-income students, being admitted to the most selective colleges has no significant effect on whether those young people achieve their dreams for life.

We're all naturally fascinated with pecking orders. We can't resist reading the latest rankings of colleges, restaurants, movie stars, even mouthwashes. Yet we don't

seem to notice that many of our bosses at work and leaders in government attended colleges and universities far from the top of the U.S. News & World Report rankings.

The best research on the effect of college selectivity is still the 1999 study by Stacy Berg Dale, a researcher at the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, and Alan B. Krueger, a Princeton economist who later became chair of the White House Council of Economic Advisors.

Their remarkable report, a National Bureau of Economic Research Working Paper titled "Estimating the Payoff to Attending a More Selective College," examined 14,239 students at 30 colleges, ranging from the most selective, including Yale and Swarthmore, to less selective places like Denison University and Penn State. The students enrolled in college in 1976 and were surveyed on how much money they were making 20 years later.

Dale and Krueger found that those who attended more selective schools did "not earn more than other students who were accepted and rejected by comparable schools but attended less selective colleges." They concluded that "unobserved characteristics," such as persistence, humor and warmth, might have influenced success in life as measured by salary, but getting into the pickiest schools did not.

One exception, they said, was low-income students. Those who attended more selective schools on average earned slightly more. Since 1976, the racial mix of college students has changed, with the percentage of white students dropping from 84% to 54% by 2020, as the percentage of all other racial and ethnic groups rose. Whether that shift might alter the conclusions of the Dale-Krueger study is unclear; there's been no comparable study addressing that issue.

A 2018 study by Suqin Ge, Elliott Isaac and Amalia Miller found that women who attended more selective colleges made more money than similar women who attended less selective colleges. But the reason appeared to be that women who attended selective colleges were less likely to marry and put their careers on hold for child rearing.

We can see in our own lives and from academic research that successful people do not come only from ultra-selective schools. In fact, most people I have interviewed

about how college helped them succeed point to a specific program, professor or even informal connection made on campus, not to the selectivity of the school itself.

The opportunities provided by American colleges, whatever their selectivity, appear quite obvious to young people from Asia and Africa who enroll here. Steve Becker, a former high school counselor in Pennsylvania, does a wonderful job of explaining how this works on his website, lesshighschoolstress.com.

He ranked colleges just before the pandemic by the number, not the percentage, of first year students with SAT math scores over 700 or ACT math scores over 30. Such people were in the top 5% of test takers. Here are the top 10 U.S. schools on that scale in descending order: University of Michigan, UC Berkeley, Ohio State, University of Wisconsin, University of Texas Austin, Purdue University, University of Washington, UCLA, Rutgers University and Texas A&M. He found Michigan had 5,200 of those top students in its entering class and Texas A&M had 3,300.

"So if you know very bright, hard-working students who feel like they have to 'settle for' Purdue

because they were turned down by Northwestern or Notre Dame," Becker said, "point out to them that they'll have as many top-5% math students in their freshman class at Purdue as the other two universities put together."

Becker also points out a 2012 study by the Chronicle of Higher Education on employers' priorities when choosing applicants just out of college. The study ranked eight factors in deciding whom to hire. Here they are in descending order: nature of college internships, what jobs they had in college, college majors, volunteer experiences, extracurricular activities, relevance of coursework and grade-point averages. College reputation was the very last factor.

Much has been written lately about Americans losing faith in higher education, but there's little evidence of that in the high schools I study, from wealthier suburban campuses to urban charter schools full of ambitious but lower-income students. The word "college" still retains a magic in those places.

We may still obsess over the college rankings and argue over what the Supreme Court does. But there is no question that colleges of every sort improve lives in innumerable ways, no matter what percentage of applicants they let in.

lead-up to the midterms. Lastly, Democrats should learn to accept that not all election security measures equal voter suppression, and Republicans should learn that voter access is good politics.

Or we can do nothing, let the partisan acrimony continue to boil, and hope the problem goes away on its own. In the meantime, the indispens-

able talent that makes up the unseen-but-essential backbone of American democracy will continue to slip away under a deluge of tribal acrimony.

If we don't stand up for election workers, we're going to be forced to reckon with a world without them. And that's a nightmare scenario for democracy. The choice is ours.

With federal lawmakers considering but so far failing to act on the issue, efforts to standardize food date labels have been underway for years in California. In 2017, after an earlier unsuccessful attempt to mandate changes, the state Legislature adopted voluntary standards for food labeling. But despite support from industry groups, studies show that store shelves and consumer refrigerators are still filled with

food bearing labels that are inconsistent with the standards.

Other countries have dealt with the problem. An analysis of international date labeling laws by Harvard Law School's Food Law and Policy Clinic showed that the U.S., where federal date labeling requirements are limited to baby formula, is an outlier. The European Union, with a market of 450 million consumers, requires all packaged food products to have one of two standard date labels: "best before," for use as a quality indicator, or "use by," for food that

may pose increased safety risks past the indicated date.

Consumers should not bear the burden of discerning the difference between labels such as "Enjoy by" and "Expires on." Mandating the use of uniform date labels is the best way to ensure customers keep food out of landfills and keep money in their pockets.

Tips and tricks to prepare for your trip

THESE SPRING DAYS BEGIN with a coolness in the air that invites us to get to the outside work as quickly as possible. There is much to do to prepare all the beds and the tall Greenstalk planter. Meanwhile, those hardy little plants in the greenhouse are daily growing taller and leafier. Transplanting time will soon be upon us!

Rob and I have two helpers for the housework and garden. Lisa, is a young woman who comes once a week to clean the house and help me organize. She sweeps the back patio and would even pull weeds if asked. Her ministrations make the house shine! Our other helper, so called, is

not quite as obliging. Pierre wants to be involved in everything we do and I think he truly believes he is helping when he pulls large, branched sticks back down the hill or digs up the bulbs I plant in the fall. If he could speak he would insist on telling me, "If you're digging, I'm digging."

Last year Rob and I decided to abandon the spacious garden beside my greenhouse at the top of the hill. Instead we

used large pots and several raised beds, as well as the tall Greenstalk planter for vegetables and flowers. All these were placed outside the back door, only a couple of steps from the pool and patio. This worked well but using this method meant the soil in all the pots and beds must be replenished with nutrients every spring. The other part of preparation for planting in the beds and pots involves using cardboard, groundcloth and a lot of mulch around the raised beds to make the area weed-free and presentable. Last year I put down a layer of cardboard, with a thick carpet of straw on top. It worked very well and I pulled not a single weed from that area all summer. However,

this spring I noticed the straw and cardboard disintegrated, which is good for building up the soil, but not a happy situation for me, as I had to start the whole process over again!

Jumping right into the fray with his usual enthusiasm, Pierre grabbed a piece of cardboard and started tearing it to pieces. Thank-

Convergence insufficiency: Making reading a chore

Q: I just read a letter in Dear Abby about a lady with problems reading comfortably and it sounded just like me. How common is this, and is age a factor?

A: I also read those advice columns, you just could not make this stuff up! The case you mention is actually a fairly common, and is not really “age-related.” Many people find that reading for a long time is very tiresome or uncomfortable. Some people even have some doubled vision while reading. In fact, some researchers believe that underlying eye problems may cause “reading avoid-

ance” — and of course learning problems.

We fairly commonly see patients whose glasses prescription is correct for each eye, but there has been no testing or prescribing for how your two eyes work together. This “eye teaming” or binocularity is critical for effortless and comfortable read-

ing. The specific condition you mention is called “convergence insufficiency.” When we read our eyes automatically do three things: they turn inward (convergence) to align on a letter or word at close distance, our internal eye muscles contract or “work” to change our focus from distance to near (accommodation) and our pupils constrict a little (miosis). Only first two really affect our reading skills.

A thorough eye examination should include testing to determine if your eyes actually do converge and align as a precise team for close work. We

can actually measure how much your eyes converge, or turn inward, to properly align for reading. Deficiencies in your binocularity can be compensated by using “prism” lenses. These not only contain your Rx for seeing clearly, but also additional correction to make your eye alignment accurate and easy.

Then, step two is to be certain that your eyeglass lens lab actually fabricates your lenses to exactly match your eye alignment measurements. This is commonly missed these days by optical laboratories, I suppose due to cost or time or lack of care.

Having the right prescription in each lens is only part of the process for restore clear and comfortable vision.

While we do find these binocularity disorders in patients of any age, it is more likely found in children because has noted they are not keeping up with the other children in reading speed or comprehension. Usually a teacher or parent will bring the child in because of this reading problem. For adults, no one is checking so it would be up to you to be sure your eye exam is thorough enough to find binocularity disorders.

Lastly, I should add that over the counter “readers” never have prism correction included. In fact, readers always have the same Rx in each lens (while real people usually are not identical) and they never include correction for astigmatism, the most common vision disorder of all. So be sure you are getting a truly thorough vision exam, and be sure your glasses are made accurately. Reading should be easy and enjoyable!

Good Lord, deliver me. Amen.



Thank you for your good words and works. — (From D from Hattiesburg, Mississippi)
A: Thank you, dear D, for your courageous prayer. What I particularly love about your prayer is that it connects praying with the search for truth and with the great obstacles to the search for truth which are indeed cowardice, laziness, and arro-

gance. We often think of prayer as a search for some reward from God. However, that sought reward is often a gift that we are best advised to seek for ourselves through hard work and not through petitions from God. The other areas that truthful prayer can explore with great value are repentance, awe, and

look the moments of awe and wonder that are sprinkled through our days like God's diamonds.

My most favorite object of bedtime prayers are just two words: thank you. As I have quoted many times in this column, the medieval Christian mystic Meister Eckhart reminds us all that if the only prayer we ever say is thank you, it will be enough.

The hardest task in the pursuit of truth is combating the idea that there is no such thing as truth but merely an endless list of personal opinions with no truth to anchor them. This is called ethical relativism. That would leave us like a survivor on a deserted island. The greatest decision in our lives is the decision that some things are absolutely true. If that decision is not made with all the conviction of our soul, then our lives are empty and bereft.

To return to your wonderful connection between prayer and truth from Kenya brings us to an abundant number of contemporary issues. Many times we are challenged

with new information that is difficult. Taking a deep breath and stretching ourselves to accommodate our changing world, our health, or our beliefs indeed requires courage. We have all experienced the lack of clarity from half-truths. When we are confronted with information that doesn't appear to sit right with us we need the strength and fortitude to pursue the whole of the truth. And then, as always, we pray for the humility to understand that each of us will never possess the whole of all the truth, but we can always hope that we will be introduced to the truth eventually.

This is God's promise through the prophet Isaiah, “That which had not been told to them they shall see, and that which they have not heard, they shall understand.” (Isaiah 52:15)

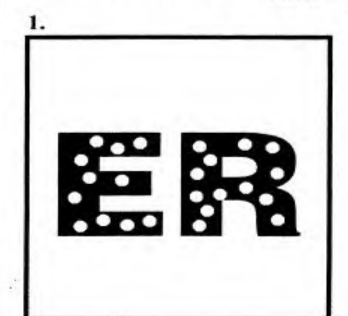

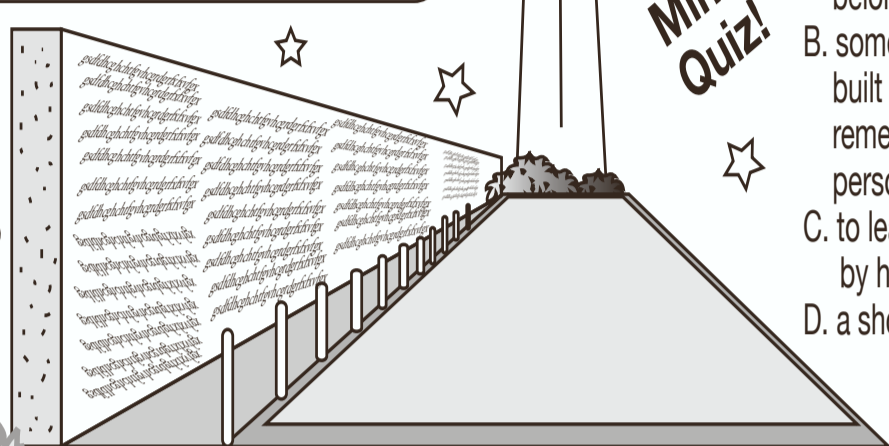

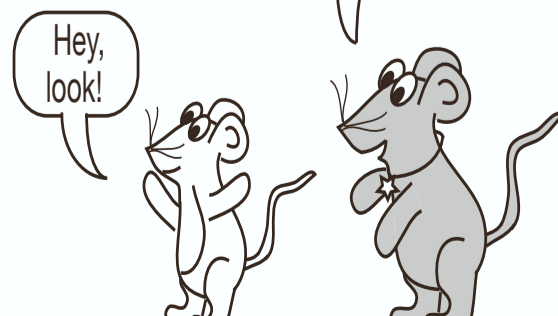

Miss hiking during mud season?

These Colorado desert destinations are perfect for spring

DENVER — Spring in Colorado is colloquially known as shoulder season (or mud season), as folks come off the slopes and wait for the snow to melt and alpine wildflowers to bloom. When it comes to hiking, however, we're making the case that this time of year should be rebranded as desert season.

For some, it likely already is. Tourists flock to enjoy the stunning desert scapes in Moab, Utah, this time of year before temperatures rise to nearly 100 degrees in the summer months. But if you can't make it that far, Colorado also offers locations where you can hit the trails, enjoy the rock formations and (mostly) avoid trekking through mud.

When it comes to desert hiking, prepare for prolonged exposure to the sun with sunscreen, hats, sunglasses and lots of water since the terrain doesn't typically offer much shade. Some canyons have flowing water, though others don't, so if you're bringing a dog make sure to pack enough for everyone to stay hydrated.

Here are four desert destinations to check out this spring. Keep these in mind for fall, too, when the weather turns slightly chillier.

Great Sand Dunes National Park and Preserve

Nestled up against the Sangre de Cristo Mountains near Alamosa lies the Great Sand Dunes National Park and Preserve, home to the tallest dunes in North America. Hidden Dune and Star Dune share the accolade, each measuring 741 feet from base to summit. Both are hikeable, too, but you'll need some grit. There are no designated trails that take hikers to the top and hiking in sand can be more difficult than on a compacted trail. The Great Sand Dunes National Park and Preserve also has hiking trails around the park's edges, where the dunes meet the mountains, as well as some forested trails.

Spring is one of the most popular (and crowded) times to explore as snowmelt fills Medano Creek, which runs alongside the dunes, and offers visitors a cool respite for swimming and fishing. Sand temperatures heat up in the afternoons, so mornings are optimal for hiking. And park officials warn that snow and high wind are possible this time of year, so be prepared for various weather conditions.

Experts like outdoor enthusiast and activist Parker McMullen Bushman, a.k.a. Kween Werk, recommend bringing a buff, goggles, a good-coverage hat and, of course, sunscreen for protection against the elements. They also wear gaiters to keep sand from getting in their shoes.



Grand Junction

The state's western edge is largely high desert terrain, thanks to the Colorado Plateau that extends from the Rocky Mountains south and west to Utah, Arizona and New Mexico. Its most famous geological attraction is the Grand Canyon, but for those looking to stay closer to home, there are numerous canyons, gorges, plateaus and mesas within Colorado state lines.

With more than 20,000 acres of desert scape, the Colorado National Monument near Grand Junction is a great place to start your desert adventure. It offers a variety of short and long hikes, as well as a canyon rim drive. Some of the most popular trails include Devils Kitchen at the south end of the park, which boasts a couple of seasonal waterfalls, and Serpents Trail, an out-and-back so named for its plethora of switchbacks. (Fun fact: It was the park's original automobile road until 1952.)

Mesa County's most recognizable landmark is Mount Garfield, which overlooks the town of Palisade. Hikers can reach the top if they're willing to walk up about 2,000 feet in elevation. According to the Bureau of Land Management, there are two trails that lead to the top: The 2-mile Mount Garfield Trail is shorter but more strenuous, while Gearhart Mine Trail is 2.5 miles.

McInnis Canyons National Conservation Area

The McInnis Canyons National Conservation Area,



northwest of Grand Junction, encompasses more than 120,000 acres of high desert canyon country. One of its most distinctive areas is the Black Ridge Canyons Wilderness, which includes the second-largest concentration of natural arches in North America, per the BLM. Expect a trek, though, as most are located deep within what's known as Rattlesnake Canyon, which is only accessible by foot (15 miles round trip) or a rough 4x4 road.

Many of the trailheads start near Fruita and Loma before extending west through the vast

desert into Utah, making this area a destination for backpackers. In fact, the 142-mile Kokopelli trail goes all the way to Moab. There are plenty of day-use areas, too, and other entry points and campgrounds along the conservation area's north boundary west of Mack, Colo.

Gunnison Gorge National Conservation Area

The Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Park recently reopened its South Rim Road for visitors, following a winter closure. But if you're looking to explore an area less traveled, con-

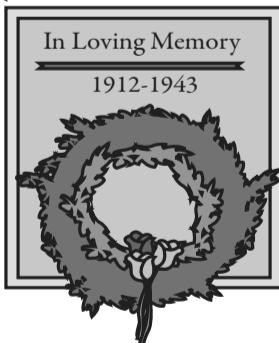
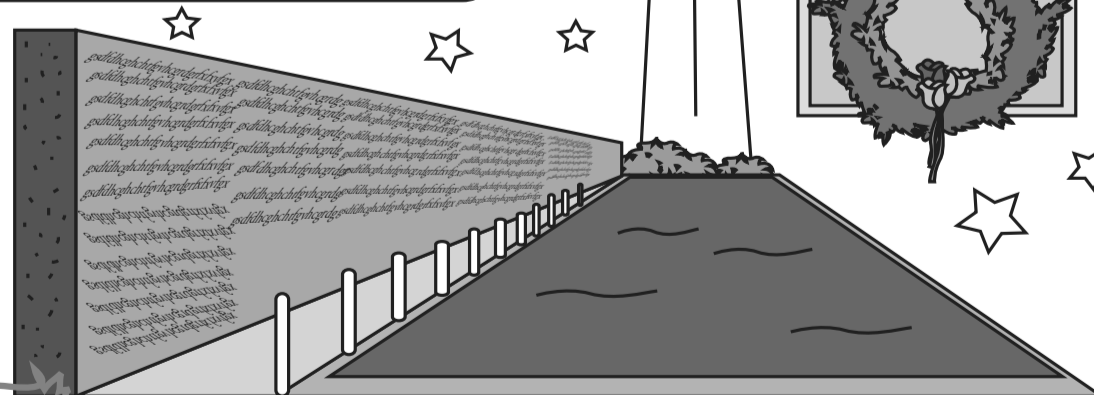
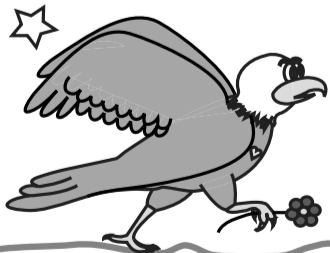
sider the nearby Gunnison Gorge National Conservation area near Delta.

This 62,000-plus-acre stretch of terrain, which includes adobe badlands and slopes lined with juniper and pine trees, features several canyon hikes and OHV routes. The roads are rugged and some might require 4x4 capabilities. Several trails will take you all the way down to the Gunnison River where the shore is dotted with campsites. Some are for hikers and some are designed for boaters, as the area is also a rafting and kayaking locale.

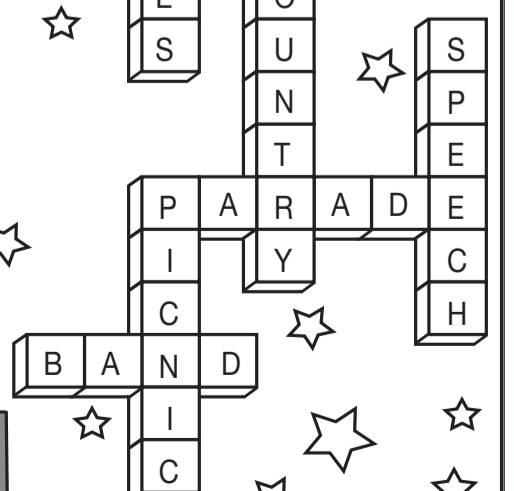
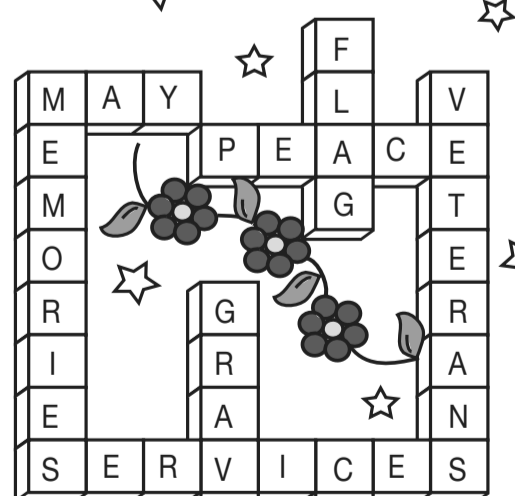
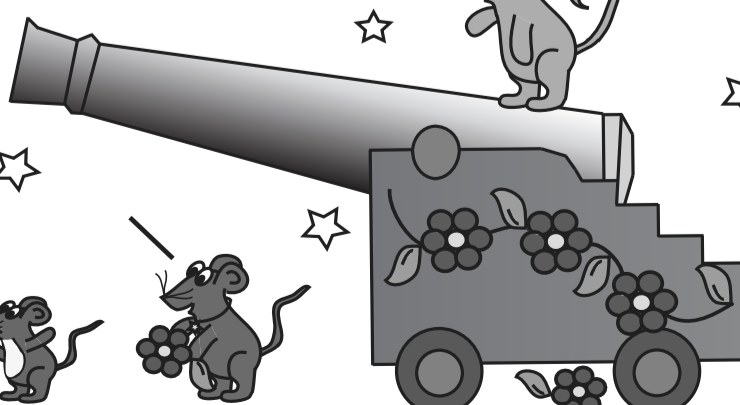

On Gardening: The queen rules with elegance in this year's mixed containers

Oh my gosh, the queen has spoken.

I am talking about the plant queen, who indeed does rule all mixed container designs in 2023: Queen Tut papyrus, Proven Winners' new selection in their Graceful Grasses program.

I've been showing several images in previous articles, and even more on my Facebook page. The gardening public has gone simply wild about the delicate look provided by each tufted airy stem. I simply forgot that last year was a trial year for garden writers and such, and therefore this year it is new to the gardening public.

Botanically speaking it is Cyperus prolifer, and despite it being from Africa, you do not need the Nile River to grow it (or any river, creek or body of water). You may have seen some growing in water gardens, but they will do just fine in mixed containers.

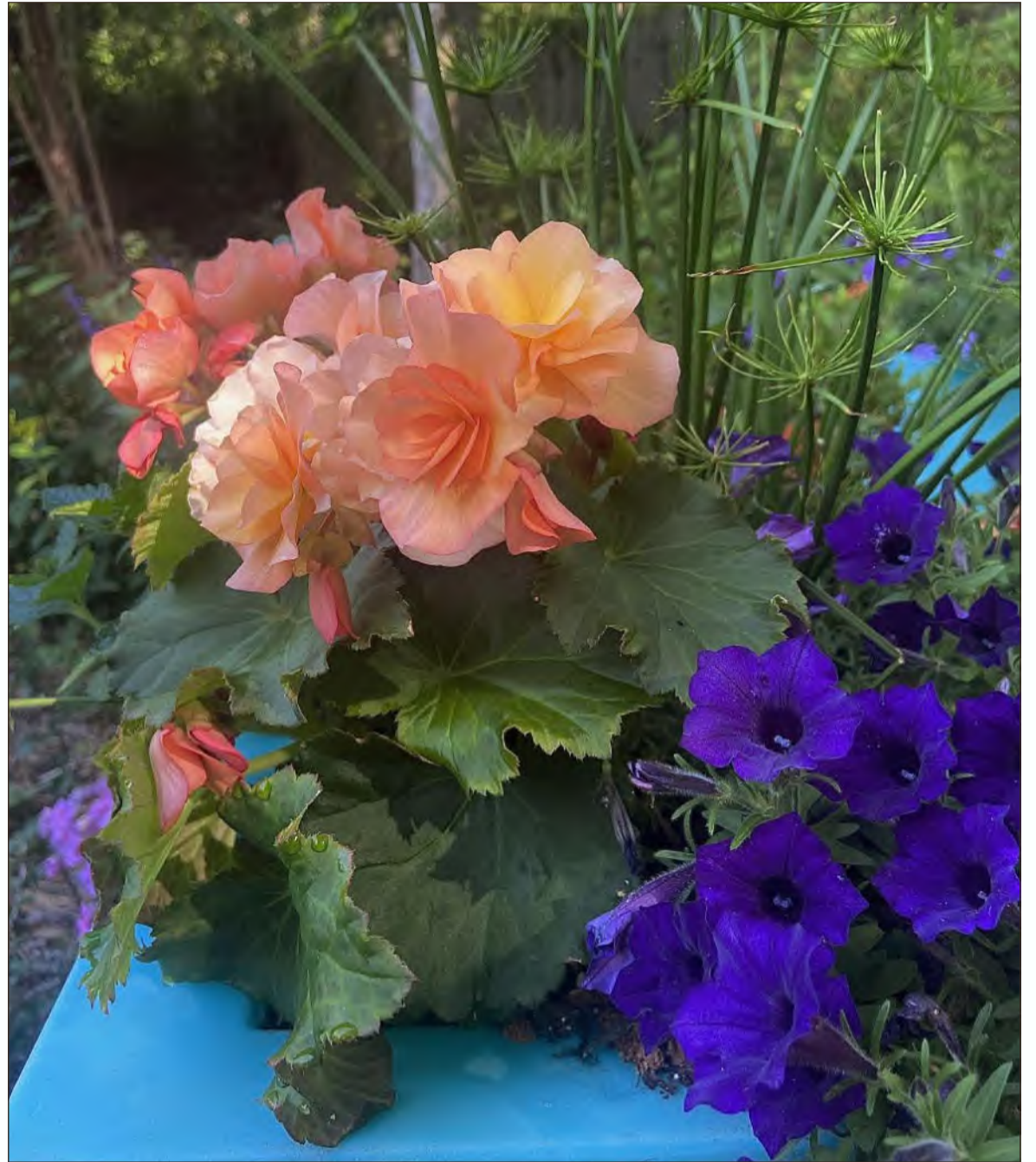
Since you will be growing it in a mixed container, you do not need to worry about how perhaps it needs more water than your Superbells, Superbenas or Supertunias. Most of us are relegated to watering our containers every day in the summer, and this will be perfectly fine for the queen.

The next biggest fear or misconception: If Prince Tut papyrus needed the jaws of life to get out of the pot, surely this will be the same with Queen Tut. This is simply not the case — or it wasn't for me, as I simply pulled them out of last year's containers. These are annuals everywhere I have lived, but they might be perennial in zones 9 and warmer.

Queen Tut is the grassy element you have longed for: It reaches 18 to 24 inches tall with a 12-to-18-inch spread. When you design your containers, don't worry about its spread. Simply plant it in the center and then start placing fillers and spillers around it. (I can tell many of you are fretting over how many plants are in your containers — or maybe mine.)

You might be asking, what size of container is that? You put how many plants in there? Most of my pots are 14 inches; I have a couple of 16-inch pots and a few in the 10-to-12-inch category. I am a sucker for reconstituted bamboo and agave containers and was forcibly stopped at the back door as I was taking my wife's glazed orange pot made out of paper.

My 14-inch pots have a

thriller and four to five others representing spiller and filler: Believe me, even when planted I still may stick a sprig of Lemon Coral Sedum or Goldilocks Creeping Jenny in a little spot that sees sunlight just to see what develops over time.

But back to the star of the show, Queen Tut papyrus. To me this is like Elizabeth Bar-

rett Browning's poem "How Do I Love Thee?" I love it with Heart to Heart Burning Heart caladiums; I love it with Solenia Apricot's glowing begonia blossoms and paired with blue petunias. I love it in mixed containers that are so colorful they look like sapphires and rubies. Yet the crown on top is the elegant Queen Tut.

The point is, you cannot create a mixed container that will not be made more beautiful by the addition of Queen Tut papyrus. Now your challenge will be finding this gorgeous grass.

Toothpick holder example of the beauty of art glass

COLLECTIBLES DON'T NEED to be utilitarian. In fact, many of today's collectibles have a purpose that has been lost to time. For example, how often do you see a toothpick holder in use? Toothpick holders, especially from the 19th century, are miniature examples of the beauty of art glass, pottery, porcelain or silver. They often resemble tiny vases or figurines and may sell for lower prices than larger pieces by the same makers.

This porcelain toothpick holder sold at Woody Auction for \$84. The auction describes it as "bag-shaped," but it is an unusual example.

Bag-shaped vessels tend to be shaped like upright bags with the opening as the neck. This one is shaped like a bag lying on its side, tied closed, with a gilt-edged "hole" as the top opening.

It is decorated with painted sprays of flowers and marked with the initials "J.P.L.," the mark of Jean Pouyat, one of the many porcelain makers in Limoges, France. There is also a complex signature of intertwined letters; likely the mark of the painter. Some porcelain factories in Limoges sold blanks, or undecorated pieces, to be painted by artists or hobbyists.

Q: I follow your column regularly in the Sunday Republican and enjoy it very much. I own four bronze sculptures by Frederic Remington. They are all about 12 inches tall. They are in very good condition. Can you give me an idea of their value?

A: Frederic Remington (1861-1909) made 22 different sculptures beginning in 1895. The first four were cast in bronze at the Henry-Bonnard Bronze Co. in New York. Beginning in 1900, his sculptures were cast at the Roman Bronze Works in New York. All his original bronzes are marked with one of those two foundry names. His bronze scul-

tures are the most reproduced bronzes. Most of the original sculptures are about 24 inches tall or larger. Original Remington bronzes sell at auctions for \$75,000 or more. The 32-inch bronze sculpture titled "The Broncho Buster" sold for over \$600,000 a few years ago. Reprod

uctions sell for under \$500. The website of the Frederic Remington Museum in Ogdensburg, New York (FredericRemington.org), has information and a form you can fill out if you think you have an original Remington sculpture.

Q: I bought a picture that was in a bundle of old city maps in a thrift store about 15 years ago. It looks like an old print. The title is "Rotterdam A.D. 1615" and it pictures a harbor filled with old sailing ships. There are different flags flying from the ships' masts. Several ships have flags with three wide horizontal stripes in red, white and blue. The harbor is ringed with houses and more flags. A banner above a portrait of a man and two scenes are at the top. There is a legend at the bottom. The picture is 14 inches high and 25 inches wide. I'd like to know what this is and if it has any value.

A: The red, white and blue striped flag is the Dutch flag. Rotterdam is an early spelling of Rotterdam.

It sounds like you have a picture of a celebration that took place in Rotterdam Harbor in 1615. The portrait might be of an explorer or an important

political figure. Without information on the printer or publishing date, we can't tell you how old your print is or what it's worth. It's not nearly as old as the date on it, but it could be a more recent copy of an older picture.

You can type words on the banner or in the legend into an online translation site like Google Translate, which has a "Detect Language" tool, and it will tell you what this picture represents. Let us know what you find!

Q: Did Seth Thomas ever use a clock face for an Adamantine mantel clock that has the numbers "3" and "9" positioned sideways? I'm in the process of buying the clock but want to know if it might be a replacement

clock face.

A: Seth Thomas (1785-1859) opened a clock shop in Plymouth, Connecticut, in 1813. The Seth Thomas Clock Co. was incorporated in 1853. It is no longer in business. The company made some clocks with numbers positioned like yours, with the 3 and 9 sideways, the 6 and 12 upright and the rest of the numbers at a slight angle. On some clock faces with Roman numerals, the numbers III (3) and IX (9) are sideways and the numbers between them are upside down as you face the clock. On clock faces with Arabic numerals, the numbers are "right-side up." Seth Thomas made Adamantine mantel clocks beginning in 1882. Some clocks made between 1881 and 1918 were stamped on the back or bottom of the

case with a date letter code.

The year is written backward, and the letter is the month. The date code for August 1906 would be "6091 H" (H is the eighth letter of the alphabet and August is the eighth month of the year).

TIP: Stains on porcelains can be removed by soaking them in a mixture of 2 tablespoons denture cleaner and 1 quart tepid water.

Dubai's next big thing? \$5B man-made 'moon' as the city's real estate market booms

DUBAI, United Arab Emirates — Who says you cannot reach for the moon? A proposed \$5 billion real estate project wants to take skyscraper-studded Dubai to new heights — by bringing a symbol of the heavens down to Earth.

Canadian entrepreneur Michael Henderson envisions building a 274-meter (900-foot) replica of the moon atop a 30-meter (100-foot) building in Dubai, already home to the world's tallest building and other architectural wonders.

Henderson's project, dubbed MOON, may sound out of this world, but it could easily fit in this futuristic city-state. Dubai already has a red-hot real estate market, fueled by the wealthy who fled restrictions imposed in their home countries during the coronavirus pandemic and Russians seeking refuge amid Moscow's war on Ukraine.

And even though a previous booms-and-bust cycle saw many grand projects collapse, Henderson and others suggest his vision, funded by Moon World Resorts Inc., where he is the co-founder, might not be that far-fetched.

"We have the biggest 'brand' in the world," Henderson told The Associated Press, alluding that the moon itself — the heavenly body — was his brand. "Eight billion people know our brand, and we haven't even started yet."

The project Henderson proposes includes a destination resort inside the spherical structure, complete with a 4,000-room hotel, an arena capable of hosting 10,000 people and a "lunar colony" that would give guests the sensation of actually walking on the moon.

The MOON would sit on a pedestal-like circular building beneath it and would glow at night. Henderson discussed the project at the Arabian Travel Market earlier in May in Dubai.

Already, artist renderings commissioned by Moon World Resorts have played with the location for his MOON — including at the Burj Khalifa, the world's tallest building at a height of 828 meters (2,710 feet). Others have placed it at the Dubai Pearl, a long-dormant project now being destroyed near the man-made Palm Jumeirah archipelago, and on its unfinished sister, the Palm Jebel Ali.

The Pearl and the Palm Jebel Ali represent two "white elephant" projects left over from the 2009 financial crisis that rocked the sheikhdom and forced Abu Dhabi, the capital of the United Arab Emirates, to provide Dubai with a \$20 billion bailout.

Now nearly 15 years later, Dubai largely has turned around. Rents on average across Dubai are up 26.9% year-on-year, even with anti-price-gouging protections. Dubai saw 86,849 residential sales last year, beating a previous record of 80,831 from 2009.

"Dubai is in a completely different world compared to" 2009, said Lewis Allsopp, the CEO of the prominent Dubai real estate agency Allsopp & Allsopp. Launched products are "selling out on the spot."

Inflation and interest rate hikes around the world have led to fears of a global recession. The UAE's currency, the dirham, is pegged to the dollar, meaning it has followed lock-step the hikes imposed by the Federal Reserve.

But cash still remains king for Dubai buyers, with fourth-fifths of transactions paid in currency without financing in 2022, said Faisal Durrani, the head of Middle East research at real estate agency Knight Frank.

"You could argue that the interest rate hikes that are taking place, to an extent the market is a little bit shielded from that given the fact that so much of the transactional activity has been driven by cash," Durrani said.

Other major projects are moving ahead. Nakheel, the state-owned developer behind the Palm Jebel Ali, has relaunched development plans for it. The developer also unveiled a multibillion-dollar plan to build 80 resorts and hotels on the man-made Dubai Islands, though it remains largely empty and under the flight path of the nearby Dubai International Airport, the world's busiest for international travel.

The MOON project also includes space for a possible casino as well. Gambling remains illegal in the UAE, a federation of seven hereditarily ruled sheikhdoms on the Arabian Peninsula. However, major brands like Caesar's Palace already exist or hope to build in Dubai. Wynn Resorts plans to build a \$3.9 resort in Ras al-Khaimah north of Dubai with gambling to open in 2027 — meaning a change to the law is likely to come.

Like other high-profile, eye-catching marvels, the MOON could fit well into "the legitimacy formula of Dubai's ruling elite," said Christopher Davidson, a Middle East expert who wrote the recent book "From Sheikhs to Sultanism." Dubai also hosts the UAE's space center, which has sent a probe to Mars and unsuccessfully tried to put a rover on the moon.

"They can be seen as a non-democratic elite but nonetheless believe strongly in science and progress — and that's ultimately very legitimizing and a megaproject like this would seem to tick all of those boxes," Davidson said.

Henderson's plan would go a step further than other globe-shaped projects, such as the MSG Sphere, a \$2.3 billion dome blanketed by LED screens, that is set to open in Las Vegas later this year.

His structure would be fully spherical, and could be illuminated alternatively as a full, half or crescent moon.

The brightness may not go down well with potential neighbors — plans to build another MSG Sphere in London were halted after residents protested the significant light pollution and disruption the structure would cause.

"It's hard to please everybody," Henderson acknowledged. "You might need dark curtains."

Looking for a house? High mortgages, few homes lead to biggest annual price drop in 11 years

LOS ANGELES — A persistently low inventory of homes on the market held back U.S. home sales again in April, even as the national median sale price posted its biggest annual drop in 11 years.

Existing home sales fell 3.4% in April from March to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 4.28 million, the National Association of Realtors said Thursday. That's slightly below what economists were expecting, according to FactSet.

Sales sank 23.2% compared with April last year. The annual drop was steepest in markets across the Western part of the country, where sales plunged more than 30% from a year earlier.

The national median home price slipped 1.7% from April last year to \$388,800, the NAR said. While modest, the year-over-year decline is the biggest since January 2012, the tail end of a multiyear slide in home prices after the mid-2000s housing bubble burst.

The latest housing market figures are more evidence that even with prices easing back after rising for more than a decade many would-be homebuyers remain frustrated by a stubbornly low supply of homes for sale and elevated borrowing costs.

"We have a very strange dynamic," said Lawrence Yun, the NAR's chief economist. "Sales are down, even prices are down, yet multiple offers are happening on at least

one-third of the properties (that) have been sold above their list price."

The U.S. housing market has yet to emerge from a slump that started a little more than a year ago, when the average rate on a 30-year mortgage began to climb from ultra-low levels, eventually doubling to just over 7% by the fall. When mortgage rates rise they can add hundreds of dollars a month in costs for homebuyers on top of already high home prices.

That benchmark home loan rate tends to track the moves in the 10-year Treasury yield, which rose sharply last year as bond investors reacted to the Federal Reserve aggressively hiking its main borrowing rate — the central bank's main tool against

four-decade high inflation.

The average rate on a 30-year mortgage climbed to 6.7% in early March, which likely hurt sales in April, as a lag of a month or two usually exists between a signed contract and a completed home sale.

Mortgage rates have mostly edged lower since that early March spike. The average rate on a 30-year home loan rose to 6.39% this week, according to mortgage buyer Freddie Mac. A year ago it averaged 5.25%.

"Right now, home sales are just bouncing a little higher or a little lower, depending upon the movement of the mortgage rates," said Yun.

The elevated rates and low for-sale inventory have forced many would-be

homebuyers to the sidelines during the past year, resulting in a lackluster start to the spring home-buying season.

Through the first four months of 2023, existing home sales are running about 27% below the pace in the same stretch last year. Sales are down 33% from their most recent peak in January 2022, the NAR said.

The shortage of homes for sale has kept the market competitive, driving bidding wars in many places, especially for the most affordable homes.

The combination of high borrowing costs and intense competition for the most affordable homes on the market is keeping many first-time buyers on the sidelines. They accounted

for 29% of home sales last month, up from 28% in March.

All told, there were 1.04 million homes on the market by the end of April, up 7.2% from the previous month and up 1% from April last year, the NAR said. That's still well below pre-pandemic levels. Consider, in April 2019 there were 1.8 million homes on the market.

That amounts to a 2.9-month supply at the current sales pace, an improvement over the 2.6-months in March and 2.2 months a year ago. Still, in a more balanced market between buyers and sellers, there is a 5- to 6-month supply.

"If we had more inventory more sales could get done," Yun said.

Real estate Q&A: Does neighbor have to pay for water damage?

Q: The upstairs neighbor in my high-rise condominium had a leaking toilet, and the water damaged my ceiling. The repairs cost me over a thousand dollars. It took several phone calls and follow-ups to get him to fix the leaking toilet, and now he refuses to pay for the necessary repairs to my bathroom ceiling. What can I do? — Don

A: People are responsible for the damage they cause. Everyone is responsible for maintaining their property well enough that

it does not harm a neighbor's property.

Your upstairs neighbor is responsible for the damage his leaking toilet caused you.

Calling him to try to resolve the problem was a good first step. Since it did not work, your next step should be to document your attempt to work things out by sending him a certified letter. Be firm and polite, explaining the issue and asking your neighbor to step up and fix the damage he caused.

Keep detailed records of the damage, cost, and each step you take to resolve the dispute.

If the letter does not have the intended effect, your next step is to involve your community association. Speak to your property manager, and follow up in writing. Remember to keep a record of every step you take.

Your condominium's rules likely require each unit owner to maintain their property. These rules also make your neighbor responsible for his negligence, and your community association should be able to help resolve the problem.

If none of these efforts get your neighbor to pay for your loss, you will have no

choice but to take him to court.

While hiring a lawyer for a thousand-dollar loss may be uneconomical, you can sue him in small claims court. As the name implies, small claims court is designed to help people resolve more minor disputes and have a simplified procedure that many people can navigate even without the help of an attorney.

Check the court's website, or head down there, for the simplified forms and instructions to bring your claim. The records you kept will help you prevail when you get your day in court.

Average long-term U.S. mortgage rate rose to 6.39% this week, Freddie Mac says

LOS ANGELES — The average long-term U.S. mortgage rate edged higher this week after a two-week drop, a modest move in line with a mostly moderate shift in home-loan rates in recent weeks.

Mortgage buyer Freddie Mac said Thursday that the average rate on the benchmark 30-year home loan rose to 6.39% from 6.35% last week. The average rate a year ago was 5.25%.

The average benchmark rate has moved lower in seven of the last 10 weeks since reaching a high for this year of 6.73% in early March. Still, it remains elevated relative to 2020 and 2021, when the

average rate fell below 3%.

High rates can add hundreds of dollars a month in costs for homebuyers, limiting how much buyers can afford at a time when the housing market has slowed, but remains unaffordable to many Americans after years of soaring home prices.

"Higher mortgage rates have slowed home purchase activity during a time in the year when typically home shoppers are out in full force," said Lisa Sturtevant, chief economist at Bright MLS. "Rate-sensitive homebuyers have either been priced out of the market or are holding off in the hopes that rates will fall."

Sales of previously

occupied U.S. homes fell 23.2% in the 12 months ended in April, marking nine straight months of annual sales declines of 20% or more, according to the National Association of Realtors. The national median home price fell to \$388,800 last month — down 1.7% from a year earlier and the biggest year-over-year drop since January 2012, the NAR said Thursday.

Despite the pullback in home prices, a dearth of properties for sale is fueling bidding wars in many markets. One reason for the limited number of homes for sale: Many homeowners who locked in an ultra-low mortgage rate in recent years are reluctant to sell now that

rates have since doubled.

Low mortgage rates helped juice the housing market for much of the past decade, easing the way for borrowers to finance ever-higher home prices. That trend began to reverse a little over a year ago, when the Federal Reserve started to hike its key short-term rate in a bid to slow the economy and cool the highest inflation in four decades.

Rates for 30-year mortgages usually track the moves in the 10-year Treas-

ury yield, which lenders use as a guide to pricing loans. Investors' expectations for future inflation, global demand for U.S. Treasuries and what the Fed does with interest rates can also influence rates on home loans.

The Fed has raised its benchmark interest rate 10 times in 14 months. At its meeting of policymakers two weeks ago, the central bank signaled that it could finally pause its yearlong campaign of rate hikes, though a pause would likely only nudge

mortgage rates slightly lower.

Yet recent warnings from several Fed officials about the continuing threat from high inflation suggest it's far from certain that the central bank will forgo another increase in their benchmark rate when they next meet in mid-June.

The average rate on 15-year fixed-rate mortgages, popular with those refinancing their homes, held steady this week at 5.75%. A year ago, it averaged 4.43%, Freddie Mac said.

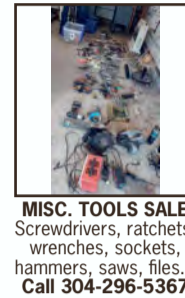

RX Still Intact

Lexus Crossover Gets All-New Design, Keeps Its Buttery Ride

Every time Lexus uses the words “completely redesigned” regarding the RX crossover, I get nervous.

I’m worried they’re going to wreck it.

The things that made the RX wildly popular from the beginning are actually pretty boring, and they don’t need to be “completely redesigned.”

I want the smooth ride to stay the same. I want the carved-in-stone cabin to stay the same. I want the Old Faithful reliability to stay the same.

Fortunately for me and millions of RX fans, the all-new 2023 version seems to keep all that intact.

It’s noticeably better in some ways, especially the technology and spaciousness it offers.

Lexus dumped the old CD player and often-maligned touchpad for a much cleaner, more modern, easier-to-use touchscreen interface on the new-generation RX. It’s a huge leap forward, although still not as slick as what some of its competitors are offering.

One unusual tech feature is Driver Attention Alert, which watches the driver’s eyes and scornfully beeps at you when it suspects you’re not paying attention to the road. It gives you a much-deserved digital finger wagging if you look down at a smart-

phone, but it also sometimes overreacts and flags a distraction when you’re watching traffic or pedestrians on the side of the road, doing exactly what cautious drivers should. This feature needs some tweaking.

While it’s the exact same length as the outgoing model, the new wheelbase is 2.36 inches longer. That helped designers repack the interior to create more back-seat legroom and cargo capacity.

A fresh platform makes the new RX nearly 200

pounds lighter than the outgoing model while also being more rigid. It’s a bit lower than the old RX, too, which helps with handling and loading height at the rear door.

There are a lot of changes to the exterior styling, but I would consider them different, not necessarily better. Its new look continues an evolution toward bigger grilles and beefier stances. I don’t think it’s timelessly pretty, but I do think it’s exactly what many buyers want: assertiveness in sheet metal.

This new RX looks like more of a performer than it actually is. My tester, the range-topping F Sport Performance trim with a hybrid 367-horse powertrain under the hood, was engaging to drive but not exactly exciting.

Instead, the RX is at its best when the goal is isolation, not adrenaline. Every version is great at that, thank goodness.

There are four different powertrains on tap, starting with the base RX 350, which packs a turbocharged,

275-horsepower four-cylinder. It’s the version I’d pick because it plays to the RX’s strengths of efficiency, comfort and value.

The RX 350h is designed to get excellent gas mileage by combining a 2.5-liter engine with a battery boost for 246 total system horsepower. The wunks in Washington rate it for 37 mpg in city driving.

The RX 500h, the version I tested, is built for performance with more than 400 pound-feet of torque. Its gas mileage takes a commensu-

rate hit but is still not bad at 27 in the city and 28 on the highway.

Unlike the outgoing model, which was available in an extended-length version that squeezed in a third-row seat, the newest RX is only available with two rows.

Pricing starts at \$48,550 for the RX 350, what I see as one of the best luxury values of the year. The fuel-economy-oriented 350h starts at \$50,150, and the quick 500h F SPORT tops the price list at \$62,750.

Transmission fluid good for the life of the car? Are high gas-mileage standards attainable?

Q: I have a 2006 RAV4, four-wheel-drive with 125,000 miles, in excellent condition. It doesn’t have a dipstick for the transmission so it’s a sealed system. Is the fluid good for the lifetime of the car? Of course, what is the lifetime since I’ve had Toyotas go over 225,000 miles? Or should I have the transmission fluid changed? It’s kinda pricey at \$500-plus.

— R.P., Phoenix

A: Toyota believes the transmission will last the life of the vehicle, which is often 200,000 or more as you have found out. The only time you may need new ATF (automatic transmission fluid) is if there is a failure. Not likely. I have even seen cars with regular transmission fluids go that far without changing the fluid.

Q: After discovering an unfortunate flat the other day, I refilled the tire and bought a can of spray-in leak repair. My mechanic flipped saying that stuff ruins your tire’s pressure gauge monitor. Am I lucky that I didn’t use it?

— K.T., Highland Park, Ill.

A: Every can of tire inflator should say on the product that it is safe for tire pressure monitoring devices. If it doesn’t, the stuff is probably so old it should be tossed out.

Q: If you own an all-electric car like a Tesla and you are in an accident and need “jaws of life,” is there an area on the car where the tool should not be used? Are first responders and firemen being trained for any concerns?

— J.S., Chicago

A: Training is readily available from auto manufacturers as

well as several fire professionals’ organizations. Number one on the list is to avoid cables with orange insulation. Since this is beyond my area of expertise, I defer to the brave people who save lives for a living.

Q: It seems with all the trucks being sold and the reduced number of sedans being sold, the EPA required mileage standards cannot be met. Is the standard a soft “suggested” target now, while we hope that the auto companies can meet the 2026 standard? How do electric vehicles fit into this 2026 standard? Do the cold winters in Minnesota and other northern states with associated reduced vehicle mpg get considered in this standard?

— T.K., New Brighton Minn.

A: Your hunch is right, more new trucks than cars are being

sold. (Crossover small utility vehicles had not been counted as trucks in the past.) Corporate average fuel economy (CAFE) standards are set by the government and measured with EPA standardized tests. Comparing electric vehicles to internal combustion engines is apples to oranges. In cold northern states, your fuel economy may suffer, but the official EPA city/highway figures are still from the standardized test.

Q: I own a 2020 Chevrolet Silverado 3500 with a 6.6-liter gas engine. Bought this beautiful beast to tow a fifth-wheel RV and the truck has done that many times. I love the truck but am having an issue with the brake hydro booster dripping fluid. This is after having the hydro booster replaced twice. My longtime mechanic has perused the internet and

talked to GM repair staff but so far nothing has come up to explain this expensive, seemingly endless repair. Hoping you can.

A: Chances are, there is a worn seal inside the booster unit. Although some mechanics will go through the trouble to replace the seal, most will opt for a remanufactured unit. Sometimes it helps to pump the brake pedal four or five times before starting the engine. Not sure why this helps.

Repelled by high car prices, Americans are holding on to their vehicles longer than ever

With new and used cars still painfully expensive, Ryan Holdsworth says he plans to keep his 9-year-old Chevy Cruze for at least four more years. Limiting his car payments and his overall debt is a bigger priority for him than having a new vehicle.

A 35-year-old grocery store worker from Grand Rapids, Michigan, Holdsworth would probably be in the market for a vehicle within a few years — if not for the high cost. For now, it’s out of the question.

“You’re not going to get one for a price you can afford,” he said.

Holdsworth has plenty of company. Americans are keeping their cars longer than ever. The average age of a passenger vehicle on the road hit a record 12.5 years this year, according to data gathered by S&P Global Mobility. Sedans like Holdsworth’s are even older, on average — 13.6 years.

Blame it mainly on the pandemic, which in 2020 triggered a global shortage of automotive computer chips, the vital component that runs everything from radios to gas pedals to transmissions. The shortage drastically slowed global assembly lines, making new vehicles scarce on

dealer lots just when consumers were increasingly eager to buy.

Prices reached record highs. And though they’ve eased somewhat, the cost of a vehicle still feels punishingly expensive to many Americans, especially when coupled with now much-higher loan rates.

Since the pandemic struck three years ago, the average new vehicle has rocketed 24% to nearly \$48,000 as of April, according to Edmunds.com. Typical loan rates on new-car purchases have ballooned to 7%, a consequence of the Federal Reserve’s aggressive streak of interest rate hikes to fight inflation.

It’s all pushed the national average monthly auto loan payment to \$729 — prohibitively high for many. Experts say a family earning the median U.S. household income can no longer afford the average new car payment and still cover such necessities as housing, food and utilities.

Used vehicle prices, on average, have surged even more since the pandemic hit — up 40%, to nearly \$29,000. With an average loan rate having reached 11%, the typical monthly used-vehicle payment is now \$563.

Kitchen closing: 'Rachael Ray' bids farewell to daytime TV

After 17 seasons of weekday food and fun, the kitchen is closing for "Rachael Ray."

That's the program that goes by that name, not the title personality, who is already looking toward new media horizons for herself.

The last episode of her syndicated talk show airs Wednesday, May 24 (check local listings for times), and it's sure to celebrate many of the top moments Ray has put forth over the better part of the past two decades — both as a culinary and lifestyle authority and as someone whose interviewing skills have developed considerably during the run of the program (which won the Daytime Emmy for outstanding talk show three times, twice in the "entertainment" category and once in "informative").

"I'm a good cook who learned how to talk to anybody over time," the ever-lively Ray says in assessing the longevity of her eponymous show, "and that's because of practice. I have always believed that anybody in America can be successful at anything if they can close their eyes and see themselves trying it. If you're not ashamed of where you come from, you never have to be ashamed of where you might go."

When "Rachael Ray" began in 2006, its bubbly host already was widely known for the cooking shows she made principally for Food Network, including "30 Minute Meals," a concept the former waitress and pub manager originated while she was a buyer for an upscale food market in Upstate New York. She parlayed that job into classes she taught to customers, which drew the interest of an area television station; the segments she did there paved the way for NBC's "Today" to feature her regularly, then for Food Network to begin showcasing her.

Recurring spots on "The Oprah Winfrey Show" progressed to the point where Winfrey became an executive producer of Ray's own talk show from its inception. However, recent Broadcasting & Cable Hall of Fame inductee Ray maintains she's never been overly concerned with how she fares as an interviewer of other celebrities, despite how many of them have passed through "Rachael Ray."

"I just don't think that translates to people who do what I do, service people," she reflects. "You never think about how you did; you think about the customer. I think Howard Stern is the greatest interviewer on the planet. He grew into it because he was grateful for the job he had, and I think of it that way. If you do any-

thing long enough, you're going to be better at it than when you started."

Throughout the run of "Rachael Ray," the host (a major advocate for the people of Ukraine, as seen on the show) has had a true partner — if not always on camera — in her husband, musician and lawyer John Cusimano. Besides contributing melodically to the program, he effectively became Ray's co-host when the coronavirus pandemic forced her to halt the usual method of production on her show, normally taped in a Manhattan studio. The couple headed upstate to their home in Lake Luzerne, New York,

and did a bare-necessities version of the program from there. (A fire ravaged the house in the summer of 2020, but they rebuilt it in a little over a year.)

"I crossed a line for the first time," Ray muses. "I never thought I'd be able to say I loved working from my home, because a few years ago, that was the thing I was most afraid of ... that anybody would cross the barrier of coming into my home. No magazines, no TV shows. I was so strict about it because it was my safe place, just for me and my family. Then with the pandemic, I had no choice. And then after my house burned

down, I really had no choice! We had to live in one bedroom with one bathroom, and we had to tape from our guest house for two years. It was a weird time."

As for what lies ahead for Ray, she intends to work again with many of her "Rachael Ray" colleagues in channeling much of her focus and energy into her new venture, Free Food Studios. It has a commitment for an A&E series — for that network's Home.Made.Nation initiative — tentatively titled "Rachael Ray Meals in Minutes," the first effort in a new library of programming she in-

tends to build with fellow producers she has worked with before. She also plans to nurture new talent in the food-show space.

"There's tons of great content out there, now more than ever," Ray reasons. "We're going to be working on platforms on multiple levels. The world is constantly changing in that way, and I feel so lucky as an American woman in her 50s to still be relevant. It's exciting and cool, and it proves the point that you can do anything you want. I feel that I've been given so many great opportunities."

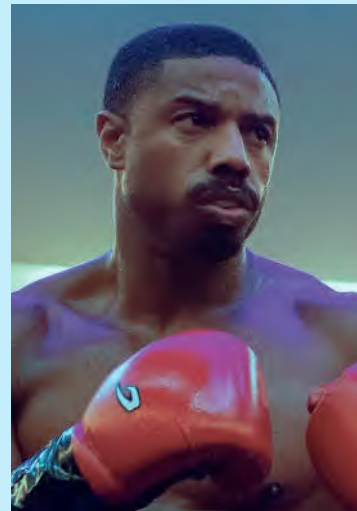

A 'Scandoval'-ous reunion: All things must end, it seems. Friendships, relationships, reality shows ... nothing can last forever. But in true "Vanderpump" tradition, all that ends, ends with a bang.

The explosive "Vanderpump Rules Reunion Special" commences for a 10th year — split into two non-stop, drama-filled installments — with "Part 1" premiering Wednesday, May 24, on Bravo.

Each and every season of "Vanderpump" serves hot gossip and jaw-dropping moments, but it's safe to say that Season 10 truly takes the cake. Avid 'Vander-lovers' will know that February and March were show-stopping months for some of the show's regulars, and as the season wraps up, fans are desperate to know where the Toms (Schwartz and Sandoval), Raquel, Ariana and Katie all

stand.

To recap, "Vanderpump" returned with new episodes in February of this year, following the split between Tom Schwartz and Katie Maloney. For those who don't know, "mermaid-ing," as it's been dubbed, is exactly what it sounds like: people (strong swimmers, at that) don mermaid tails and other fun, aquatic accessories to perform at parties, events and aquariums — even children's swimming lessons. They model, work in

Now 'Lodi': McGregor boards new Prime drama

Now 'Lodi': Actor Ewan McGregor ("Obi-Wan Kenobi") is shifting away from infiltrating the Galactic Empire, and focusing on infiltrating the mob instead.

According to *Variety*, the actor has boarded a new crime drama that is currently in development and destined for Amazon's Prime Video streaming service. He will both star in and executive produce the series.

Titled "Lodi," the series is said to be inspired by a true story, one that was chronicled in an *Alta* online article by Andrew Dubbins.

Here's the official description for it: "In 1977, a car salesman, Lou (McGregor), goes from ordinary small-town citizen to FBI informant infiltrating the mafia when a key member of organized crime offers to buy his Cadillac dealership. Over the next three years, Lou finds his quest for glory tested when he becomes embroiled in the inner workings of the crime family — from fronting a multimillion-dollar operation, to becoming a surrogate son — before procuring the first-ever conviction of an infamous crime boss."

Joining McGregor on the project is Timothy Greenberg ("The Daily Show"), who is reportedly on board as showrunner and an executive producer, alongside fellow exec producers Allie Goss and Jon Liebman of Brillstein Creative Partners, and co-executive producer Kaleb Tuttle (also of Brillstein).

As for McGregor, he's currently working on the Showtime/Paramount+ adaptation of *Arbor Towles'* bestselling novel, "A Gentleman in Moscow." The story is set in the aftermath of the Russian Revolution and follows Count Alexander Rostov (McGregor) after he is imprisoned for life.

His most recent acting role was in this year's "You Sing Loud, I Sing Louder" film, which also starred his real-life daughter Clara McGregor. And that wasn't their first joint project, either: Clara also had a small role in another Ewan-led film, 2018's "Christopher Robin," in which she is credited as Girl in Aircraft Design Office.

'Zero' casting: The upcoming Netflix series "Zero Day," starring Robert De Niro ("The Irishman," 2019), is moving ahead, and recently, four big names were added to the cast list.

The series will mark De Niro's first outing as a TV series regular, and his character, George Mullen, is described as "a massively popular, but complicated, former American president who is pulled from retirement to head a commission tasked with investigating a devastating global cyberattack" (per *Netflix*)

De Niro will be joined by actress Lizzy Caplan, fresh off her star turn in Paramount+'s recent remake of "Fatal Attraction." Connie Britton ("The White Lotus"), Jesse Plemons ("Fargo") and Joan Allen ("The Bourne Ultimatum," 2007) have also boarded the project, which was officially greenlit in March.

There's a strong family element to this political story. Caplan has been tapped to play the role of Alexandra Mullen, "a young Congresswoman who has sought to distance herself from her father's political legacy," while Allen's Sheila Mullen is "the former first lady and nominee to the federal bench whose professional ambitions take a back seat to her husband's political career."

Meanwhile, Plemons will play Roger Carlson, a "former Mullen 'body man' seeking a return to the national stage alongside Mullen," and Britton's Valerie Whitesell is "a savvy, intelligent political operative who was Mullen's former chief of staff."

From writers/executive producers Eric Newman ("Narcos: Mexico"), (former NBC News president) Noah Oppenheim and (Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist) Michael S. Schmidt, "Zero Day" will consist of six episodes once it arrives on the streamer. No word yet on a premiere date.

'Magnificent' TV: Saddle up — "The Magnificent Seven" is coming to Prime Video.

A remake of Akira Kurosawa's 1954 masterpiece, "Seven Samurai" (which was initially titled "The Magnificent Seven" state-side), the original "Magnificent Seven" film was released back in 1960. The western has, thus far, spawned three film sequels — 1966's "Return of the Seven," 1969's "Guns of the Magnificent Seven," and "The Magnificent Seven Ride!" — a TV series that ran from 1998 to 2000, and a 2016 remake starring Denzel Washington

("The Equalizer 3," 2023), Chris Pratt ("Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 3," 2023), Ethan Hawke ("The Black Phone," 2021), and more.

Add another TV series — a reboot — to that list.

Nic Pizzolatto, who co-wrote the 2016 film, is currently developing a TV version, which was initially envisioned as an original series. It has since been reimagined as a new take on the classic.

No stranger to TV success after creating HBO's wildly successful anthology series, "True Detective," Pizzolatto will write and executive produce the new "Magnificent Seven" series.

Here's the official logline: "In the tradition of the great epics from the golden age of westerns, an outlaw and his cohorts must unite a disparate band of indelible fighters to defend a settlement of immigrant homesteaders in an open range war against cattle barons in central Texas, telling an expansive saga of adventure, action and romance."

As reported by *Variety*, the reboot ties in with Amazon's recent acquisition of MGM and, in the words of Amazon CEO Jeff Bezos, its "vast, deep catalogue of much-beloved intellectual property." "Robocop" and "Legally Blonde" are some of the other classic titles that could be revived for film and/or TV.

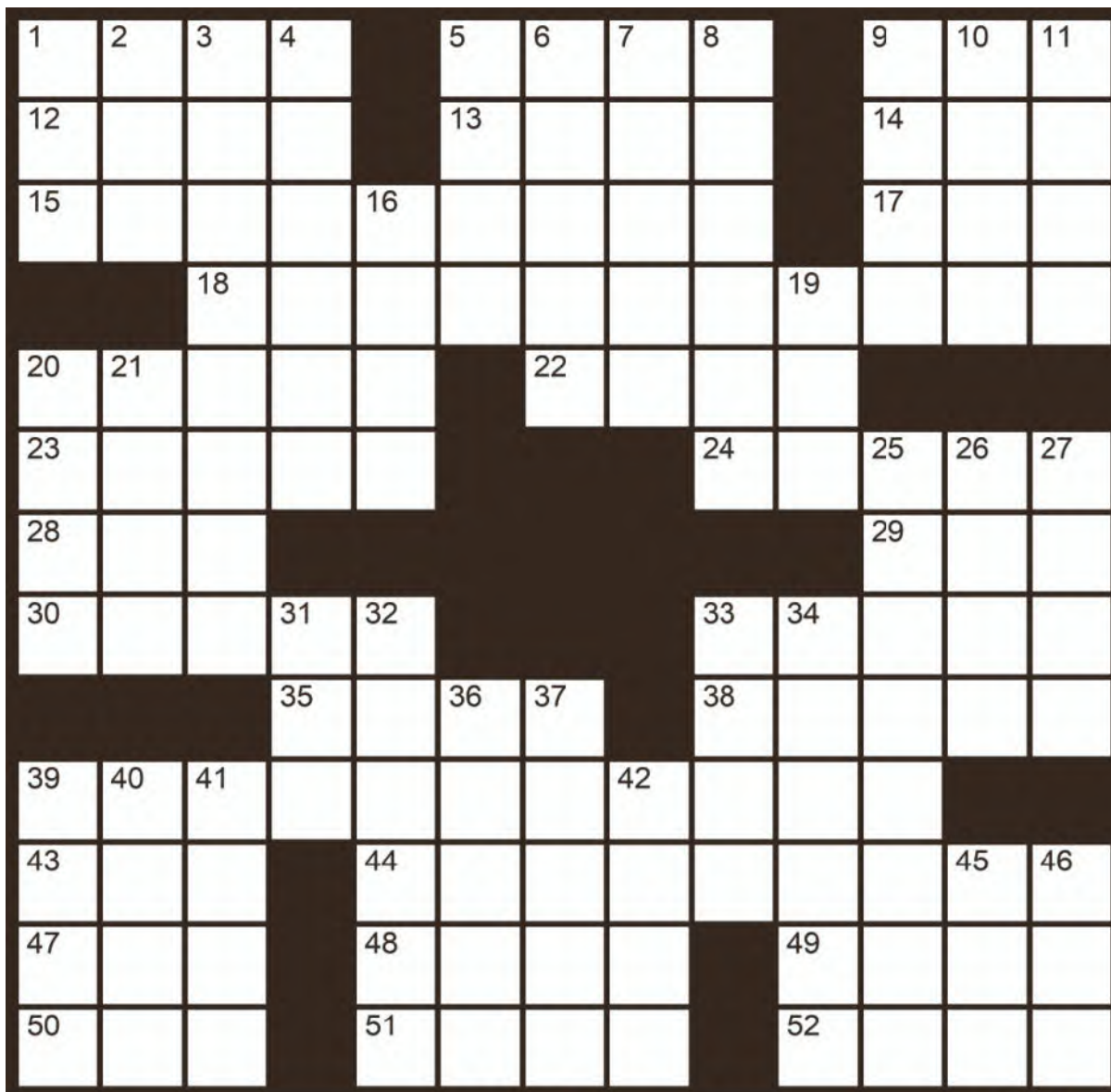
