Gotta Question?

I was recently told that many of the young people at Spring Break are Legacy Members. I'd like to know at what age a son or daughter can apply and for how long can they maintain Legacy Membership?

We asked the Membership department . . . First, Legacy Membership is only available to the children and grandchildren of Equity Members. Children can stay on their parents' Membership account until the age of 23. At that point, they must fill out an application to create their own, separate Legacy Membership account. There are no dues for the Junior Legacy Membership which is available from age 23-25. Upon reaching the age of 25, dues must



be paid. Once reaching the age of 50, they become Senior Legacy Members and the dues change accordingly. Legacy Members can maintain their Membership as long as they have a parent or grandparent who is an Equity or Patron Member. fiscal responsibility, change management and lastly, continued learning.

In official business, current Chairman **Teresa Holmes** announced the election of two new nominees, **Teresa Ferrarone** and **Joseph Urbinati, Jr.**, onto the Board of Directors, along with her own reelection so that she may serve as Immediate Past Chairman. At the end of the meeting, **Bob Manzo** assumed his new role as Chairman and named **Ray Larkin** to serve as Vice Chairman for the next two years. With the addition of the new Board Members, we say goodbye to **Barbara Hajim** and **Steve Markel**, each retiring from the Board after three years of service. A special thank you was given to Immediate Past Chairman **Bob Schmetterer**, retiring after ten years of Board service.

Holmes made the final announcement of her Chairmanship which was received with great applause. She told Members of the Board's decision to no longer provide guest cards to Members who list their Ocean Reef or Anglers Club homes for rent on online public sites such as Vrbo. The decision is detailed below.

In her closing, Holmes thanked Members for their

robust patronage and loyalty that brings the Club to life. While it was her last meeting as Chairman, for which she received an overwhelming standing ovation, she will remain on the Board of Directors as Immediate Past Chairman through 2021.

The 18th Chairman, Bob Manzo, took the podium next to talk about the Board's goals and review the direction for Capital Projects, presenting a significant shift in plans for the upcoming two years. There are two projects that will begin fairly immediately and continue through the summer, the Airport Runway Reconstruction and the Town Hall/Marina parking expansion. Mr. Manzo notes

that the Airport is being funded with \$4 million in Member/Commercial-provided contributions and \$2 million in Club funds.

Based on new information from FEMA and a team of engineers, the Board has decided that instead of building a new Clubhouse and restaurant facility where the Lobby, Ocean Room and Reef Lounge currently stand, the life of the current building will be extended, and at a great savings to the Club. In turn, other projects that had been considered in the past have moved back to the top of the agenda and include: an expansion and renovation of the Dolphin Clubhouse, improvement of the Buccaneer

Island Lagoon, Recreational Facilities at the 11-acre parcel behind Fitness, and a Parking Garage in the Associate area to help alleviate parking issues throughout the Club. This summer plans and costs will be finalized in time for necessary approvals at September's Board Retreat. As they evolve, each of these projects will be discussed at the November 2019 Town Hall meeting and covered in future issues of the *Ocean Reef Press*.

Board Announcement on Vrbo and Online Rental Listing Sites

As announced at yesterday's Annual Meeting, the Club's Board of Directors has made an important decision regarding rental listing sites. With the recommendation and

support of the Membership Committee, they have unanimously agreed that any Ocean Reef Club or Anglers property that is listed on any public website for rent will not be eligible for guest cards. This decision did not require any change to our existing rules. The rules have always held that the privilege of guest access is up to the Board of Directors and may be withheld for any reason.

For those that rent only to Social Members this has no impact, they do not need

guest cards. However, if your home is listed on any of these sites for any reason, the residence will become ineligible for a guest card for anyone. Once removed, all guest privileges will be restored. Club offerings were designed for use by Members, their families and guests.

By renting a property through Vrbo or similar website, that right to use the Club is being resold for the sole benefit of the homeowner, not the Club, and therefore not the membership at large.

The Club spends weeks vetting new Members and yet the rentals through Vrbo and others come right through our gates unabated. It does not feel right to see access to our private Club being offered to anyone who desired to visit and additionally, it creates discomfort for the neighboring residents. It is very damaging to the value of the Club's Brand and the ability to control and manage who has the right to enjoy the amenities and offerings the Club provides.

been involved in a number of community activities, including co-chairing the 2018 All Charities Auction. Bob says he and Cindy believe it's important to get involved in the communities where they live.

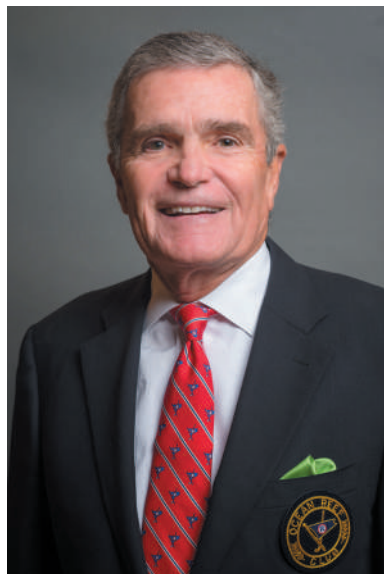
"Ocean Reef Club has become home to my family," said Manzo. "We count our blessings each and every day that we are a part of this amazing community. We are truly grateful to be here."

Operation Pedro Pan Documentary & Commentary by Those Who Lived It

“When you get to the Airport, ask for ‘George’”

Imagine saying that to your eldest child as you drop them off at the Havana Airport to be flown to the United States? Telling them to look after their siblings in a foreign country where they did not speak the language? The parents of 14,000 Cuban children did this in the early 1960’s. “This” has come to be known as Operation Pedro Pan.

If you lived anywhere but South Florida in the early 1960’s you likely didn’t hear much about this on the nightly news. Even in Miami where it was happening, most did not even speak of the Operation out of fear. Communism, CIA, conspiracy

were quiet buzzwords. Fearing indoctrination by the newly installed communist government of Fidel Castro, Cuban parents made life-changing decisions to ensure the safety and future of their children. Through a network that included branches of the Catholic Church, private schools and family contacts, thousands of children arrived in Miami with doubts of ever seeing their parents again. It would become the largest recorded unaccompanied child refugee exodus in the Western Hemisphere.

So who was George?

George, or “Jorge” Guarch, immigrated from Cuba in 1949 and was the father of “**J Guarch, Jr.**” Ocean Reef Club Equity Member since 2004. They lived near the Miami International Airport and Jorge Sr. worked for the Catholic Welfare Bureau. Jorge would meet the children at the airport, record data into a handwritten log before they were transported

to one of four South Florida camps: Florida City, Kendall, Matecumbe or Florida City. For some children, they were fortunate and were united with family and friends upon arrival, others were put into foster homes and even orphanages. Because there were boys and girls camps, many siblings were separated.

The largest challenge was the lack of facilities in South Florida to care for the growing numbers of arriving children. The Bureau solved the problem by asking Catholic Charities to provide foster care, group care and orphanages. Locations spanned 200 cities in 48 states and U.S. territories.

Fast forward 50+ years to the Ocean Reef Golf Clubhouse. J Guarch is introduced to **Tony Rodriguez**, they strike up a conversation and quickly J detects a familiar accent. When he asks Tony if he is in fact Cuban, Tony replies, “Cuban by way of Nebraska.” J then knowingly says, “My father was George.”

To say the rest is history is an



understatement.

The community is invited to experience the incredible film documenting Operation Pedro Pan as told by caregivers, historians, Pedro Pan mothers and children themselves. Equally as fascinating will be the opportunity for a Q&A with fellow Club Members Tony Rodriguez and J Guarch, and joined by the film’s Executive Producer and also a Pedro Pan, Carmen Valdivia.

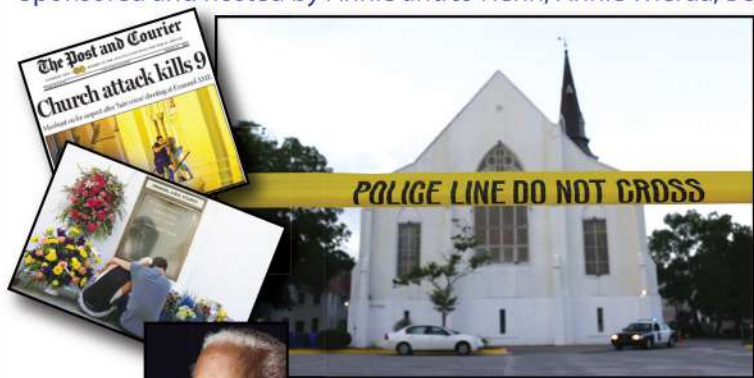

Forgiving the Unforgivable

Emanuel, a documentary film that focuses on the aftermath of the 2015 massacre of nine victims in a church in Charleston, SC, has an exclusive preview at Ocean Reef for one night only

When my neighbor Em Wierda asked if I would alert Ocean Reef Members to a screening of Emanuel, a 75-minute documentary film that her son Ben, a friend of the writer, had highly recommended. I readily agreed.

No problem, I thought. I'll just knock out a few paragraphs for the *Ocean Reef Press* detailing time and place (**April 18 at 7:30 p.m. at the Cultural Center**) and include a short synopsis of the plot (the 2015 massacre at the Emanuel Church in Charleston, SC).

Then the Wierda's previewed *Emanuel* for me at their home. At the end when they turned the lights back on and I dried my tears, I was left with the feeling that I must beg, urge, cajole and try to convince every Ocean Reef Member to attend the one night only presentation of *Emanuel* at the Cultural Center.

The facts are familiar to most of you.

A number of congregants gathered for bible study at Emanuel, a large African-American Methodist Episcopal Church in the center of Charleston, SC. They were joined by a young man, a stranger, who nonetheless was welcomed into the group. During the closing prayer the stranger (a 21-year-old white

supremacist named Dylann Roof) took out his gun and killed eight of the churchgoers and their minister.

In presenting the facts, Brian Ivie, the director of *Emanuel*, first sets the scene by showing footage of Charleston's history as a major slave trading port. This is followed by selective coverage of the shooting. The horror of the murder, the chaos that always surrounds an emergency response, and then at the heart of this film (the part that breaks your heart) the anguish and grief of the survivors.

In personal interviews you are forced to imagine the unimaginable – the sudden and inexplicable loss of a loved one in a random shooting by a hate-filled terrorist.

A woman speaks of watching her son die and then having the shooter state that he would let her to live to "tell the story;" Anthony Thompson, a Charleston minister, grieves for his wife, the love of his life, a young baseball player is devastated upon learning his mother was one of the nine victims.

These and other survivors, their friends and family, and indeed most of the community of Charleston, found little satisfaction in the quick arrest of the killer Dylann Roof. On the day of his arraignment many were consumed with hate.

"Hate Didn't Win. Something supernatural happened in that courtroom," says Dimas Salaberrios, one of the producers of Emanuel and a pastor who administers to the grief stricken in mass shootings and other tragedies.

The film captures the general surprise at the unexpected announcement by the judge that he would allow one member of each of the victim's family to confront the accused Dylann Roof.

The first woman to speak had lost her mother. "I was so angry," she says. But then she



was mystified that the words that came out of her mouth were words of forgiveness. All but one of the family members who spoke that day had similar experiences.

Father, forgive them, for they know not what they are doing. Luke 23:34.

These words of Jesus on the Cross, resonated in the hearts of those touched most intimately by this tragedy. But forgiveness proved to be infectious. The city of Charleston reacted not with riots and fires but with respectful gatherings of thousands of sympathetic citizens joining hands and singing "Amazing Grace" (on one occasion led by President Obama). The potential rioters turned around and went home.

Emanuel is a movie with a strong and uplifting message, but it is also a thoroughly

professional and riveting theatrical production.

This screening is not a fundraiser. The Hardest Summer Goodbye: The Prescription Delivery Program

Life on The Reef is full of amazing and wonderful benefits, but if this is where you live, one of the seemingly most practical is also one of the hardest to leave behind for any length of time: The prescription delivery program.

When the phone rings at 9 a.m., you answer, "Hello?" "Good morning! This is the Ocean Reef Prescription Help Line. Your prescription is available and ready to be picked up at Public Safety. Have a good day."

You count blessings; you've just been saved a round-trip to Key Largo, and you are not alone.

As described in the *Ocean Reef Press* several years ago, "The program was conceived by a man who personified the 'Spirit of Ocean Reef,' Delivery Man **Herb Matthews**. Herb... personally impacted the lives of hundreds of our Members with his compassion and initiative in launching the prescription delivery service, administered by the Medical Center and Public Safety... Against all odds and in the face of skeptics who said it couldn't be done, Herb persevered."

Thanks to that perseverance, the program is now nearly 15 years old and relied upon by hundreds of Ocean Reef residents. It's so popular, it even has its own dedicated phone number (305-367-3401) so Public Safety's other lines

remain open for usual business.

Last year, 9,709 prescription packets came through the system, and in just the first two months of 2019, that number was 2,835. As Herb once explained it, "Look at the number of trips Members would have had to make, the cars taken off the road, the gas saved, the speeding tickets avoided!"

The process begins at 3:30 p.m. each Monday through Friday in season when one of the several off-duty Public Safety officers who trade off this errand departs for the three Key Largo pharmacies (CVS, Publix and Walgreens; off-season, mid-May through October, the runs are Monday-Wednesday-Friday). Depending on traffic and the number of prescriptions needing to be picked up, the officer returns to campus within a couple hours, but is then responsible for logging in each bag, a process that is typically completed by 6 or 7 p.m. and includes entering each patient into the system to receive that computerized notification phone call at 9 a.m. the next day, as referenced above. Interestingly, every participant's middle initials are the same: "ORC"!

For the Member, the package is available as soon as it's logged in and can be picked up 24/7. One friend enjoys taking a midnight scooter ride to enjoy the moon and the stars, the empty streets, and on a hot, still night, the breeze generated (and always the potential

to come across interesting nocturnal critters).

Ocean Reef Public Safety Communications Officer Gerri Viatoro has served as coordinator of the program for the past dozen years. Although the sorting of an average day's haul (75-100 bags) can be tedious – cross-referencing and alphabetizing the three pharmacies' worth of medicines,

then filing them in with the bags that are still there from the previous couple pick-ups, and finally weeding out those that have been there for several days so they can be moved over to the front desk at the Medical Center – she enjoys meeting and coming to recognize the people who pick them up, and the gratitude expressed again and again.

Prescriptions not picked up within three (or sometimes four) days are transferred to the front desk at the Medical Center where they can be picked up during regular business hours.

"It's one of our greatest programs," declares **Jim Leenhouts**, and anyone who has to spend their off-season making special trips to the pharmacy fully appreciates that sentiment. To quote a tune from the early 1960s, "I don't wanna say goodbye for the summer!"

And on that note, don't forget to transfer your prescription order to your northern pharmacy if and when you depart for the summer.

Passport to India



"From the Pantry" by Carole Kotkin, Cooking School Manager

Chef Puskar Marathe was born in India's western Maharashtra state where fresh seafood goes with heavily vegetarian cuisine. But having a father in the Indian air force meant he was in a new state every year, and he learned to appreciate the entire country's food culture.

Marathe's inventive and soulful dishes have national acclaim at the Ghee Indian Kitchen, where he has been executive chef for the restaurant's Miami's Design District location since it opened in October 2017. He has just announced he will open a small plates restaurant in Palm Beach Gardens named Stage.

But despite the chef's credentials, the restaurant's name does not refer to any kind of grandstand. Stage (pronounced "staahj") refers to one of the lowliest jobs in the kitchen, the unpaid trainee chef or stagiaire. Marathe says his goal is to create a restaurant that's approachable and elevated at once. "It will be a place where you can eat every day, but unique enough for a special occasion. Here, we will work with local, small-scale farmers and use a lot of seasonal ingredients and vegetables on the menu," says the 34-year-old chef who has been inspired by his longtime friend Niven Patel, Ghee's owner. Chef Marathe will be in Carysfort Kitchen on **Wednesday, April 17** for Passport to India, a class focusing on the ease of cooking Indian cuisine at home.

Marathe's work has taken him to Gstaad and Lucerne in Switzerland, the Cayman Islands, Bahamas, Qatar, India and the United States, where he has lived since 2007. He wants to set folks straight about common misconceptions of Indian food

being too spicy or just a curry or butter chicken. "That's not necessarily true," he says. "Curry is nothing but a blend of spices. There are many different regions in India and some hardly use any spices. I want to bring an awareness of the different regions of India." Marathe was formerly a chef de cuisine at Meat Market in Palm Beach and a line cook at 3030 Ocean in Fort Lauderdale, working for innovative chef Dean James Max (an Ocean Reef guest chef). At 3030, he worked alongside fellow cook, Niven Patel. "People used to make fun of us, saying, 'You two are going to open up a curry house one day,'" Marathe said. "But we were dreaming of something bigger. We imagined what we could do if we combined Dean James Max's style of farm-to-table cooking with Indian cuisine." That dream came true when Patel opened Ghee in Miami's Downtown Dadeland and then recruited Marathe to run the Ghee outpost in the Design District.

Bettania Salles' Shrimp Madras

- Large Shrimp – 2 lbs peeled and deveined
- Almond sauce – 1 cup
- Tomato Base sauce – 1 cup
- Black Mustard seeds – ½ tbsps.
- Turmeric powder – ½ tbsps
- Unsweetened Coconut powder – 1 cup
- Heavy cream – 2 cups
- Fresh curry leaves – 4 springs
- Hot chili powder – 1 tsp (optional)

- Vegetable oil – ½ cup

In a medium sauce pan heat it up the oil, add black mustard seeds and curry leaves, be careful because they pop up. Add the turmeric, almond sauce, tomato sauce, coconut and heavy cream. Bring to a boil, add shrimp, season with salt and chili powder (optional), cook for 10 minutes. Turn off the heat and sprinkle with fresh cilantro.

Spring is Here, I am so "Released"

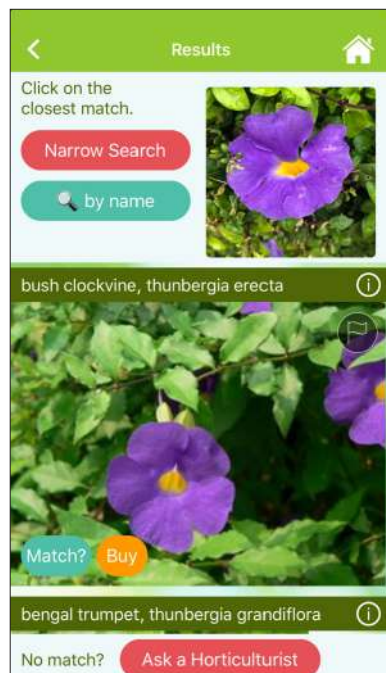

But first, download the **iscape app** iscapeit.com, which uses augmented reality (AR) to help design your outdoor living space (think yards, patios and more). Choose from thousands of shrubs, turfs, trees, mulches, water features, fire pits, fountains, deckings, etc., that you can place and

move in the app. Test it out with a photo of your outdoor space or aim your device at your actual yard or patio to create a real-time AR image. You get 4 free items to try it out (it is very cool) or sign up for a month, 3 month or annual plan. Be sure and watch the tutorial.

How Does Your Garden Grow?

Today I downloaded the **GardenAnswers plant identification app** gardenanswers.com just so I could find out once and for all if those darn trees are actually cherry blossoms. The app virtually identifies over 20,000 plants (as well as pests and diseases found on a plant) with its cutting-edge plant identification technology. Take a photo of the plant and GardenAnswers will match it with detailed descriptions. If that's not good enough, they also have a community of gardening experts who offer advice and guidance within 24 hours for \$1.99 a question. 2,000,000+ users and counting make this the #1 gardening app in the country.

Spring is in the Air

The arc of the sun shifting north is one of the cues marking the annual migration of birds northward. The Florida Keys is

known as a migration hotspot filling our neighborhood with song. Not a week goes by that I don't wonder what bird is perched in our trees or has found itself looking for a way out of our screened-in pool. Parrots once again flit from tree to tree on our street (after disappearing post-Irma), a flock of white birds glide inches above the canal behind our home, an enormous hawk-like bird flew overhead on Card Sound Road. It's time to download the free **Cornell Lab of Ornithology's Merlin Bird ID** app birds.cornell.edu to help quickly identify over 3000+ species in North, Central, and South America and Europe with just a few questions or by recognizing your photo or a bird's song. It is broken down by region and your answers to five simple questions, and presents likely candidates from the ebird ebird.org citizen scientists project's enormous database of 500 million sightings from birders. Download the ebird

app to participate in the Global Big Day – the world's biggest birding day on May 4.

Nature Nurture

April is also National Stress Awareness Month with National Stress Awareness Day falling on April 16, the day after Tax Day (though frankly, the day before Tax Day would be my first choice). This is a great time to stop and smell the roses and be at one with nature. Grab your water bottle and download the **Alltrails app** alltrails.com with more than 60,000 trail guides worldwide from Maine to France and in 30 US National Parks for hiking, running, biking, dog walking and more – it even works offline while still pinpointing your location with GPS. Find a trail near you, including near Ocean Reef, and destress with deep breaths.

"Golf Tip" by Derek Swoboda, Director of Instruction

When we think of Augusta National Golf Club, we may think of the roars on Sunday, the Pimento Cheese Sandwiches or the traditions carried on year after year. The green speeds at Augusta National Golf Club are as fast as the players will see all year on tour. How do they handle putting on such fast greens?

Grip Pressure:

The first thing we want to be sure of when putting on fast green surfaces is that we have very light grip pressure. This will help allow the shoulders to control the movement of the putter head, not the hands.

How to calibrate your speed:
Hit ten uphill putts and ten downhill putts using the same speed and stroke on all of them while not putting to a specific hole or location. This will help you feel what the speeds are like in both directions. When putting uphill, you will want to focus on a spot just farther than the hole to ensure the ball will travel to the hole. When putting downhill you will want to choose a spot before the hole in an effort to hit the putt softer or slower.

What's the most important part of putting on fast greens?

Playing more break than you normally would. When green speeds are very fast, the ball will be rolling at a much slower pace, which allows the slopes to have a greater influence on your ball.

Keep these things in mind the next time you are playing on extremely fast greens and enjoy your successes!

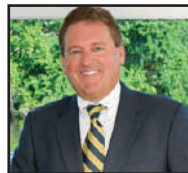

BRIDGE TIP

Overcalling Over Opening Preempts

When the opponents open a weak 2 or other preempt bid, it makes it difficult to find the right contract. If you pass, you might miss game. If you bid, you may not have enough bidding space to find the correct contract. Here are some tips:

Weak 2 Opening Bids

Direct Seat

Over the opponent's weak 2 opening bid: (See Table 1)

Examples - RHO opens 2♥: (See Table 2)

Balancing Seat

If your RHO opens with a weak 2 bid and your partner and LHO passes, then you can stretch to make a bid. Mentally add an "Ace" to your hand and use the guidelines above.

You can stretch even more if you are short in their suit and have favorable vulnerability (they are red and you are not).

Advancer Actions

After partner overcalls (2♥-2♠-

Pass-?):

- Pass with 0-7 points.
- Raise your partner's suit with 8-10 points and 3 card support.
- Cuebid your opponent's suit 10+ points and 3 card support.
- New Suit is Forcing and promises 5+ pieces.

After partner's direct takeout double (2♥-Dbl-Pass-?):

Treat your hand the same way as you respond to a normal takeout double.

- Bid at the lowest level with less than 8 points.
- Jump to the 3-level with 8-11 points.
- Go to game with 12+ points.

After partner's 2NT overcall (2♥-2NT-Pass-?):

Systems are ON!

- 3♣ is Stayman.
- 3♦/3♥ are Jacoby Transfers.

TABLE 1

12-17 HCPs and 5 card suit	Bid your suit. (Simple Overcall) Example: 2♥-2♠ = 5 spades (12-17 HCPs)
12+ HCPs and 3-4 cards in all unbid suits.	Takeout Double.
